COUNTY COMMISSION MET PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT IN A REGULAR SESSION OF THE SULLIVAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND MEETING THIS MONDAY MORNING, FEBRUARY 17, 1992, BLOUNTVILLE, TENNESSEE. PRESENT AND PRESIDINT WAS HONORABLE WILLIAM H. "JOHN" McKAMEY, COUNTY EXECUTIVE, GAY B. FEATHERS, COUNTY CLERK AND CURTIS TACKETT, DEPUTY SHERIFF OF SAID BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND OF SAID COUNTY, TO WIT:

Upon motion made by Commissioner Margaret DeVault and seconded by Commissioner Ralph Harr to approve the minutes of the Regular Session of the Commission Meeting held on January 20, 1992, be approved, same was approved by voice vote of the Commission.

County Executive informed the Commission of an approximate \$3,000,000.00 shortfall in the 91-92 Budget. This shortfall is due to the change in percentage on personal property tax being reduced from 95% to 82% plus the depreciation on personal property allowed by the State.

Due to the shortfall, motion was made by Commissioner Blalock and seconded by Commissioner Fred Childress, to wait until the March Commission meeting to see if there needs to be Budget cuts. This motion was amended by Commissioner Ralph Harr to put all expenditures on hold until March Commission Meeting including additional appropriations. The motion and amendment was approved by voice vote of the Commission.

Janet Lalimer was present, spoke in behalf of the application and presented photographs of the subject property to show existing conditions. Garland Hobbs, and Chris Birdwell adjacent property owners spoke in opposition to the request, specifically, the possibility of a mobile home park development and other uses they felt would be incompatible with the existing residential character of the neighborhood. Staff stated that B-3 and R-3A type uses would be incompatible with the residential development of the area and that access to the property from Moreland Drive as well as existing topography and drainage on the site would present problems to developers. For these reasons staff recommended that the property be approved for a PRD only. The applicants agreed to change their request and to accept staff recommendation for a PRD.

Staff noted the property lies adjacent to an existing P.M.D. and that the physical characteristics and location of the property dictate the need for a site plan review to control possible negative impact of development. Staff recommended that the commission deny the requested M-1 designation and zone the property P.M.D. to allow for site plan review.

Tim Bowery and Bill Williams spoke in support of the requested M-1 zoning. Mr. Bowery, owner of the property, stated that preparation of a site plan as required by the P.M.D. designation would cost too much and that he preferred the M-1 designation where a site plan was not required.

The Planning Commission took the following action:

File No. 11/91-5. Donald and JoAnn Salley Request. Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 10th Civil District at the end of Rustic Hills Drive from R-1 to R-3A to permit the location of apartments.

Mr. Salley spoke in support of his request stating that initial construction would be only 4 units. Mr. Birdwell, Mr. Vanover and Ms. Blodsoe, residents of Rustic Hills Drive spoke in opposition to the request stating their belief that the proposed development would have a negative impact on their neighborhood in regard to increased traffic and lowering of property values.

Staff stated that the requested R-3A zone would allow a high density development with greatly increased traffic. Staff proposed rezoning to R-2A to decrease the density allowed and resulting traffic to an acceptable level. Staff also noted the site would be screened from the surrounding neighborhood by topography and wooded areas and that the lower density development of an R-2A zone would be compatible with the existing land use.

On a motion by Eldreth seconded by Teague the commission voted to approve rezoning to R-2A as recommended by staff and with approval of the applicant Mr. Salley. Voting to approve zoning to R-2A, Eldreth, Teague, Trivett, Brown, Hickam, Belcher; voting to deny zoning to R-2A, Koehner.

File No. 11/91-5, Donald and JoAnn Salley Request. Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 10th Civil District at the end of Rustic Hills Drive from R-1 to R-3A to permit the location of apartments.

Jo Ann and Brett Salley spoke in support of the request. Stan Bledsoe and other adjacent property owners spoke in opposition to the request stating that R-3A High Density Apartment Development would be detrimental to property values as well as aesthetics and traffic conditions in the area. Staff stated that the requested R-3A zone would allow a high density development with greatly increased traffic. Staff proposed rezoning to R-2A to decrease the density allowed thereby decreasing traffic to an acceptable level. Staff also noted the site would be screened from the surrounding neighborhood by topography and wooded areas and that the lower density development of an R-2A zone would be compatible with the existing land use pattern.

On a motion by Trivett, seconded by Teague, the commission voted to approve rezoning to R-2A as recommended by staff and with approval of the applicant Ms. Salley. Voting to approve zoning to R-2A; Trivett, Teague, Eldreth and Belcher; Hickam and Greene passed.

The Planning Commission took the following action:

File No. 11/91-6, Robert Thompson Request. Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 18th civil district on the north side of Spurgeon Lane approximately 200 feet west of its intersection with State Route 75 from A-1 to M-1 to permit the location of future manufacturing development.

Robert Thompson spoke in support of his request, noting his investment in buildings now on the property. Ms. Louise Rowland, Sullivan County Historical Commission and Eddie Welch and 9 other residents of the neighborhood spoke in opposition to the request noting the historical importance of the 150 year old Spurgeon House located on the property and the fact that uncontrolled industrial development would be extremely detrimental to the rural residential area causing decreased residential property values, increased traffic and the like.

Staff noted that use of the large existing commercial structure on the site could be better controlled to the benefit of the surrounding area by zoning the property planned manufacturing district (PMD). This zone would allow site plan review to insure that development would occur in a manner that would blend in a positive way with the area.

On a motion by Belcher, seconded by Eldreth, the commission voted unanimously - Trivett and Koehner passing - to approve rezoning to planned manufacturing district (PMD) as recommended by staff and with the approval of the applicant Mr. Thompson.

File No. 11/91-8, Robert Thompson Request. Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 18th civil district on the north side of Spurgeon Lane approximately 200 feet west of its intersection with State Route 75 from A-1 to M-1 to permit the location of future manufacturing development.

Robert Thompson spoke in support of the request, noting his investment in buildings existing on the property. Eddie Welch and other residents of the neighborhood spoke in opposition to the request noting the historical importance of the adjacent Spurgeon House and the fact that uncontrolled industrial development would be detrimental to the rural residential area and would adversely affect residential property values, increase traffic and the like. Staff noted that use of the large existing commercial structure on the site could be better controlled to the benefit of the surrounding area by zoning the property planned manufacturing district (PMD). This zone would require site plan review by the planning commission to insure that development would occur in a manner that would blend in a positive way with the area.

File No. 11/91-10. R. C. Houser Request. Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 5th civil district on the south side of Holston Institute Road approximately 200 feet south of its intersection with State Route 126 from B-3 to M-2 to permit the location of future development.

Mr. Houser spoke in support of his request stating that the property is to be used for a scrap metal reclamation operation. Mr. Bill Dolaney and Mr. Doug Arwood, residents of the area, spoke in opposition to the request claiming that the proposed zoning would allow unsightly development visible to their property, create dangerous traffic conditions and be generally incompatible with the surrounding land uses.

Staff noted the property proposed to be zoned M-2 was adjacent to an existing M-2 zone and that zoning regulations required that development of property zoned M-2 be carried out pursuant to approval of a detailed site plan by the building commissioner. Conditions to be addressed would include buffer areas, screening, sanitation, and the like. Staff recommended that zoning to M-2 be approved.

On a motion by Eldreth, seconded by Trivett, the commission voted unanimously - Koehner, Belcher, Hickam, Brown passing - to approve the rezoning to M-2 as recommended by staff.

File No. 11/91-10. R. C. Houser Request. Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 5th Civil District on the south side of Holston Institute Road approximately 200 feet south of its intersection with State Route 126 from B-3 to M-2 to permit the location of future development.

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Mr. Houser did not speak concerning his application. William Dulaney and others spoke in opposition to the request noting a negative impact on the aesthetics and historic character of Blountville. Emphaels was placed on potential views of the property from the new highway to be constructed around Blountville. TO REQUEST THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ENACT HOUSE BILL 1698 (SENATE BILL 2283) TO AUTHORIZE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODIES TO SET GENERAL POLICIES GOVERNING EMPLOYMENT AND COMPENSATION OF DEPUTIES AND ASSISTANTS IN VARIOUS COUNTY OFFICES

WHEREAS, the present outdated law allows the clerk and master, circuit court clerk, clerks of special courts, county clerk, county trustee, register of deeds, and sheriff to petition the chancery court, circuit court, or criminal court (depending upon the office) for a decree or order stating the authorized number of deputies and assistants and their compensation for each such petitioning officer, and

WHEREAS, this system produces inequality of compensation of deputies and assistants between county offices for similar work and experience as well as different personnel policies in the various offices which is unfair to the county employees, and

WHEREAS, the present law allows modification of court decrees at any time, causing difficult problems in making and amending county budgets due to the uncertainty present in the process, and

WHEREAS, the present system of petitioning the courts involves the court system in a legislative function, violating the principle of separation of powers,

WHEREAS, the present system for securing deputies and assistants in county offices is expensive, time consuming, disruptive of orderly government, unnecessary, and inequitable with respect to the assistance provided to county officers, and

WHEREAS, the counties of Tennessee are operating under austere budgets and must seek ways to reduce the cost of government, and
