The regular meeting of the Sullivan County Planning Commission was held on Tuesday, October 19, 1999, 7:00 P.M., Courthouse, Blountville, Tennessee.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman with a quorum present. The minutes from the September 27, 1999 meeting were amended. Motion to approve the September 27, 1999 minutes as amended by Brown, second Boggs. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

B. Rezoning Request

1. File Number 8/99-1, Lynn W. Hicks

Reclassify R-1 property on Arcadia Drive to A-1 for a "paint-ball game field".

The applicant was present. Tim Stafford and William Boyle were chosen to represent the opposition and spoke against the rezoning. A petition was submitted in opposition for the denial of rezoning. Also a map and list of names were submitted in approval of the rezoning. Staff's recommendation was to approve the request.

Motion to deny the request by Mullins, second Belcher. Vote in favor of the motion 4 to 3 (Tie vote with the Chairman, Greene, voting in favor of the motion). Belcher, Mullins and Brown voted in favor of the motion. Boggs, H. Barnes and Childress voted against the motion. S. Barnes passed.

2. File No. 8/99-2, Darrel L. Shoemaker
Reclassify R-1 property on Bell Ridge Road to A-1 for Pond Rental "Fishing Tournaments".

This rezoning was located in the Kingsport Planning Region.

3. File No. 8/99-3, Dunn & Gurley Properties
Reclassify R-1 Property on State Route 37 & Maple Hurst Lane to PBD for future business.

The applicant was present. Ed Scarborough and Ronnie Watson were chosen to represent the opposition and spoke against the rezoning. A petition was submitted in opposition for the denial of rezoning. Staff's recommendation was to deny the request.

Motion to deny the request by Childress, second Mullins. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 1.

4. File No. 9/99-4, Charles Johnson
Reclassify A-1 property on Hwy 75 to PMD-2 for future development.

No one was present in favor or opposition of the rezoning. Staff's recommendation was to approve the rezoning request.

Motion to approve the request by Brown, second S. Barnes. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 1.

5. File No. 9/99-5, William Surgener
Reclassify R-1 Property on Fort Henry Drive to B-3 for future development.

Mr. Surgener was present and spoke in favor of the rezoning. No one was present in opposition of the rezoning. Staff's recommendation was to approve the rezoning request.

Motion to approve the request by Boggs, second S. Barnes. Vote in favor of the motion was unanimous.

6. **File No. 9/99-6, Ed Leeper, Jr.**

Reclassify R-1 property on Bloomingdale Road to B-3 for future development.

Mr. Leeper was present and spoke in favor of the request. No one was present in opposition. Staff's recommendation was to approve the rezoning request and add all of Parcel 6 in the rezoning.

Motion to approve the request by S. Barnes, second Childress. Vote in favor of the request was unanimous.

7. **File No. 9/99-7, Tony Bragg**

Reclassify R-1 property at 3800 Reservoir Road to A-1 for a "Bed and Breakfast Inn".

Mr. Bragg was present and spoke in favor of the request. No one was present in opposition. Staff's recommendation was to approve the rezoning request.

Motion to approve the request by Brown, second Childress. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

8. **File No. 9/99-8, Henry D. Cook**

Reclassify A-1 property at 4451 Hwy 126 to B-3 to allow a wholesale and retail business.

Mr. Cook was present and spoke in favor of the request. No one was present in opposition. Staff's recommendation was to approve the rezoning.

Motion to approve the request by Childress, second Boggs. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 2.

9. **File No. 9/99-9, Brenda Bowery**

Reclassify R-1 on Morton Hollow Road to R-2 for a single wide mobile home.

No one was present in favor or opposition to the rezoning. Staff's recommendation was to approve the rezoning request.

Motion to deny the request by Brown, second S. Barnes. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 2.

10. File No. 9/99-10. Residential Development LLC

Reclassify A-1 property off Island Road to R3-A for development of Condominiums and Patio Homes.

The applicant was present and spoke in favor of the rezoning. Charles Benton spoke in opposition to the request. Staff's recommendation was to approve the request.

Motion to approve the request by Mullins, second Boggs. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 1.

C. **Subdivision Plats:**

1. Robert & Carol Belcher
Staff recommended approval. Motion to approve the plat by Belcher, second Childress. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.
2. Kenneth Rutherford
Staff recommended approval with the addition of: flood status data, zoning data and notation of limiting the second lot to no further subdivision. Motion to approve the plat by Boggs, second Childress. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.
3. Warrior Falls, Phase II
Staff recommended approval with the addition of the signatures of approval from: road approval (bond), sewer approval and 911 numbers. Motion to deny the plat by Brown, second Childress. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.
4. Albert Moretz
Staff recommended approval. Motion to approve the plat by Brown, second Boggs. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.
5. Minor subdivision plats approved for October.
Motion to approve the plat by H. Barnes, second Brown. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

D. Site Plans:

1. Sexton Boat Sales (addition of storage building)
Staff recommended approval. Motion to approve the site plan by Mullins, second S. Barnes. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.
2. Heritage Shopping Center (development of shopping center)
Staff recommended approval. Motion to approve the site plan by Boggs, second Brown. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

E. New Business:

1. Tri-Cities Regional Airport
Transfer of ownership of the portion of Holston Road from Sullivan County to Tri-Cities Regional Airport to allow access to the "Fuel Farm". John Hanlin (Executive Director of Tri-Cities Regional Airport) gave a presentation that explained the purpose and the exact route that is to be changed. Motion Mullins, second Childress to transfer the ownership of the road. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 0 with one pass. The motion will now be sent to the Sullivan County Executive committee for their approval.

F. Old Business:

1. Cell Tower Regulations.
No progress was made. To be deferred for the meeting of November.
2. Quillen Request (for approval of over size storage building)
Motion to approve the addition by Brown, second Boggs. Vote in favor of the motion 6 to 1.
3. Text on the "Light Commercial Recreation"
Staff recommended deferring to next months agenda where a more comprehensive draft can be completed for review.
4. Johnson City "Rocky Mt. Historic District"
A representative from the Johnson City Planning office could not attend the October meeting but we were informed that they would attend the November meeting.

G. Public Comments:

1. Mr. Stan Harrison stated that the approval of the Frazier Site Plan, that was heard at the September planning commission meeting, had not been properly reviewed. Mr. Harrison stated that there had been some alterations to the initial site plan but they were minor. Also there was a question about the requirements of a buffer strip. The site contains natural buffer on the majority of the boundaries. The planning commission stated that buffering needs to be placed only where no natural buffer occurs. Motion to approve the site plan with its current changes by S. Barnes, second Childress. Vote in favor of the motion was unanimous.
2. Scott Barnes stated that the Sullivan County Coordinating Committee, at their October 11 meeting, had expressed their interest in trying to accomplish a uniformity in zoning and subdivision regulations in Bluff City, Bristol, Kingsport, Johnson City and Sullivan County.
3. Lynn W. Hicks addressed the committee. He stated that a member of the Sullivan County Zoning department allegedly gave out information on how to petition against a rezoning request. He expressed his discussed with the county's allegedly undermining his request.

With no further business a motion was made to adjourn by S. Barnes, second Boggs. Meeting was adjourned at 10:16 p.m.

This is the before picture of the road to the left. We agreed that the tree line on the left was an obstruction to vision so we solved the problem as shown in the next picture

The tree line is gone and the vehicle now stands out from a long distance. We are happy to work with our neighbors to solve any problems.

It is our view that the issue of noise is simply overstated. The sounds of a youth group enjoying a structured afternoon of paintball should fit nicely in a community where tractors plow fields, dogs bark, other children play and live country music has been known to play loudly into the night. Furthermore, we are not building a baseball stadium, a go-cart track or motor-cross track. We are simply playing paintball and nothing else. No loud engines, no cheering crowds and no traffic jams. Just paintball.

This picture is taken from the only visible portion of the field, Arcadia Road. The field rests between many hills, woodlands and this 4-acre field. Unless you are standing on this very spot you can't see the field unless you enter the property.

Since Stone Drive is the major artery to the area we conclude that 90% of our patrons would be traveling from this direction, leaving only 10% traveling from Bloomingdale Pike and past Dr. Boyle's property. An average group will be around 20 people, which would translate into approximately 10 cars per day. This means 9 extra cars will travel to the field and never even come close to Dr. Boyle's house leaving only 1 car actually passing by. In addition we measured Arcadia Road and it is 21 feet, the same width as Bloomingdale Pike.

Furthermore, the speed limit on Arcadia is 25 mph, contrasted to 45 mph on Bloomingdale. With such a low speed limit the likelihood of any incidents would be low. In addition to all this we are only open two days a week, which translates into 20 extra cars per week.

Paintball - July 1996



The English word opportunity comes from a Latin word that means "toward the port." It carries with it the idea of a ship taking advantage of the wind and tide to arrive safely in the harbor. The shortness of life is a strong argument for making the best use of the opportunities God gives us to share the Gospel message. It is one of the main reasons why Denise and I are still at Penn State University working with the athletes. One of my seminary professors used to always tell us "evangelism

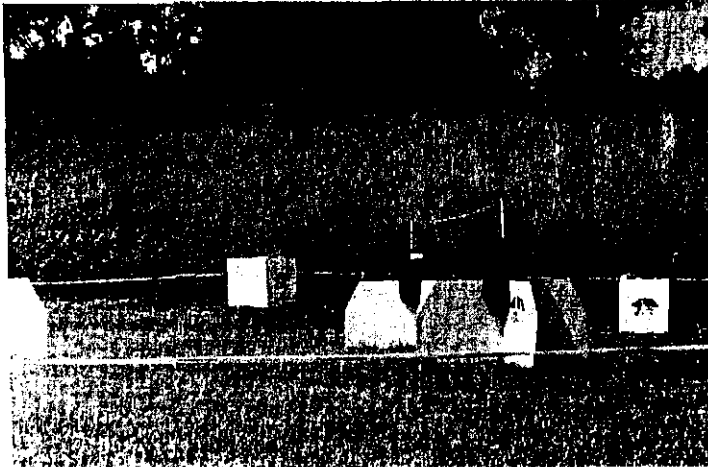
must be done where the lost people are." Every year I see more and more freshmen coming to this great institution who have never stepped foot inside a church. We believe that God has given us something to say that our audience desperately needs to hear.

One way that we have seized the opportunity to share the Gospel message was through a special outreach activity called "Capture-the-Flag" or "Hot Pursuit." The guys in one of my Bible studies decided it would be a good idea to use this means to reach some of the men on their team for Christ. This game, if you are at all familiar with it, is a high intensity game where the players use paint ball guns to "tag" their opponents. During the course of the games, we stopped play to share Biblical principles that relate to cooperation, communication, team work, unity and also shared the Gospel message. Some may wonder if shooting each other promotes violence; to answer the question, the context has to be considered. Context is everything! Through such activities as this we are creating a context or environment for fun and for learning important Biblical principles at the same time that relate to life. In this way we feel this game no more promotes violence than does playing any other contact sport.

Sixteen athletes showed up and ten of these were non-Christians, so our opportunity to witness was great. We all had a great time in the Lord playing the game! One of the athletes commented to the group that "this was the most fun I had all summer." I had the privilege of speaking to the group about the Biblical perspective of competition and then closed with a challenge for them, and that challenge was to accept

Additional considerations

1. The vote at the zoning board was extremely close with one member abstaining his vote.
2. During a recess, a discussion with members revealed that they were unaware of our full situation, due to us being caught off guard by the unexpected opposition, and stated they would have voted differently had they known.
3. The majority of the adjacent property owners supported the zoning by signing our petition.
4. The opposing petition should be disavowed since it states opposition to B-1 (business) zoning while we are interested in A-1 (agriculture) zoning.
5. Stan Harrison, the Principle Planner for East Tennessee, and the Sullivan County Planning office advised that the zoning request should be approved.
6. The paintball field is not permanent and is designed to be able to move within 2 to 3 days.
7. Arcadia Road is a very well maintained road that has no potholes or other obstructions and is quite safe at the posted speed limit.

Dollars and Approvals

On Monday June 22 the Chanhassen City Council gave final approval to the re-zoning and re-platting of our future property. A recent meeting with the developer concluded most remaining pre-closing issues, i. e., final language about timing and contingencies on the north-south road (an extension of Stone Creek Drive), final surveys, title documents, etc. Pending approval by officials of our national church body (the ELCA), a closing on the land purchase is expected about August 15.

Family of Christ will then make a payment of \$515,000 for the balance due on the land and about \$15,000 for engineering and city fees. This gets us the land as we see it today. Another \$120,000 of grading, ponding, drainage, park/trail/sewer/water

fees will be paid before construction. Coulter Boulevard and the Stone Creek Drive extension will be paid by assessments of about \$100,000 each over

an eight year period.

So the total costs for down payment, land, grading, streets -- before adding our building, parking lot, landscaping, signs, and other necessities -- come to about \$850,000. This is about \$50,000 LESS than our most recent previous estimates. It works out to \$2.34/sq ft for our combined lot and outlot, and costs even less when the shared parking agreements are considered, allowing our use of adjacent property. That portion of the whole property allowed for our use (including shared parking) is about

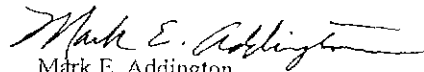
Subject: Paintball Facility - Arcadia Community

Dear Mr. Hicks:

I have received your letter requesting support for a zoning change in the Arcadia Community, outside of Kingsport where you propose to create a paintball facility. I cannot make such a recommendation because I do not think it is appropriate for this city government agency to get involved in this county issue.

I will note that law enforcement agencies throughout the country, including Kingsport Police Department, use paintball guns to teach tactical operations in a life-like situation. Should you be successful in your venture, any use of the facility by Kingsport Police Department would have to be considered based on cost, safety aspects of the facility and other factors.

In short, it is possible we might use such a facility, however, we will remain neutral on the zoning issue and let the government review process take its course.

We are writing this letter concerning the rezoning application of Lynn Hicks for a parcel of land adjoining Arcadia Dr. We testified against this application at the October 19, 1999 Zoning Commission Hearing and are still very opposed to it.

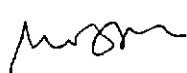
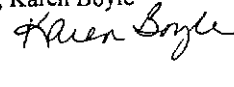
This property has been developed as a team paint ball facility in direct violation of current zoning laws. They are seeking a retroactive rezoning from R-1 to A-1 to legitimize their activities. Arcadia Drive and the Reedy Creek community is an inappropriate area for this type of business for the following reasons:

1. The entrance creates a severe traffic hazard. Arcadia Dr. is a narrow, winding, rural road with no shoulders, multiple blind hills and numerous hidden driveways. The entrance cannot be seen when approached from either direction. Frequent use of this business entrance is an accident waiting to happen and puts all of us who live on Arcadia and drive it daily at risk. We resent the disregard of the developers for our common safety.
2. When in full activity, it is a major source of noise pollution, especially to those residents on the east end of Vanderpool Dr. It is located directly in front of the Stafford and Simpson homes where they can clearly hear the discharge of the guns and the yelling of the participants. As much of the activity will occur on the weekends this creates an intolerable situation for these families.
3. Because of this loud and disruptive activity it will have a depressing effect on property values on Vanderpool Dr. and Reedy Creek in general. Would you want this facility in your front yard?
4. It is an eyesore to the community and will only become more so during the upcoming wet and rainy winter and spring months.

This business is no asset to the Reedy Creek Community. It should be relocated to a commercial area already appropriately zoned where it will not be so destructive to property values and such a threat to public safety. As taxpaying, voting landowners, we strongly protest this intrusion into our quiet neighborhood. We live here because of the peace and privacy it has provided. This is all jeopardized by this paint ball facility. Arcadia Drive and the Reedy Creek Community should be left as a R-1 zone.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this the _____ day of _____, 1999, by and between SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee (hereinafter referred to as "Sullivan County") and JIM JORDAN, HEALTH INSURANCE SERVICES (hereinafter referred to as "the Consultant"), is prepared to set forth the terms of independent insurance consultant services to be rendered to Sullivan County by Consultant regarding Sullivan County employees' health, dental and retiree insurance plans, their benefits design, bid solicitation, implementation, assessment/evaluation and acceptance processes.

In consideration of the mutual premises set forth herein, the parties have agreed upon and do hereby enter into this Agreement according to the provisions as negotiated and accepted. This Agreement will become effective on the date entered above and will continue for a period of one (1) year. Both parties have the right to terminate this Agreement with a thirty (30) days written notice [certified mail - return receipt requested]. Written termination notice must explicitly define the reason(s) for such action, i.e., performance, obligation, occupational status, health conditions, etc.; however, the contract may be terminated for any cause or no cause.

The Consultant agrees that he is an independent insurance consultant hired by Sullivan County to perform independent consultation services. Nothing in this Agreement is intended or should be construed as creating an employee/employer relationship. It is understood that the Consultant is not entitled to any of the benefits or privileges enjoyed by Sullivan County employees. The Consultant shall provide his own tools, supplies, transportation, etc.

Sullivan County agrees to compensate the Consultant a total of One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per month (all inclusive) for his services. The Consultant is responsible for his travel, mileage, meals and any and all other personal expenses. Payments will be made upon receipt of invoice from the Consultant on or before the 15th day of each month. The Consultant shall be solely responsible for any and all social security, medicare and any other withholding taxes.

This Agreement authorizes the Consultant to work directly with the Purchasing Agent and the Employee Benefits Department in the best interest of Sullivan County. In addition to the services designated herein, the Consultant shall attend all Insurance Committee meetings and/or other meetings as may be deemed necessary. The Consultant will instruct Sullivan County on any new laws, changes or enhancements in the health, dental and retiree insurance markets which could have a direct effect on Sullivan County employees' benefits.

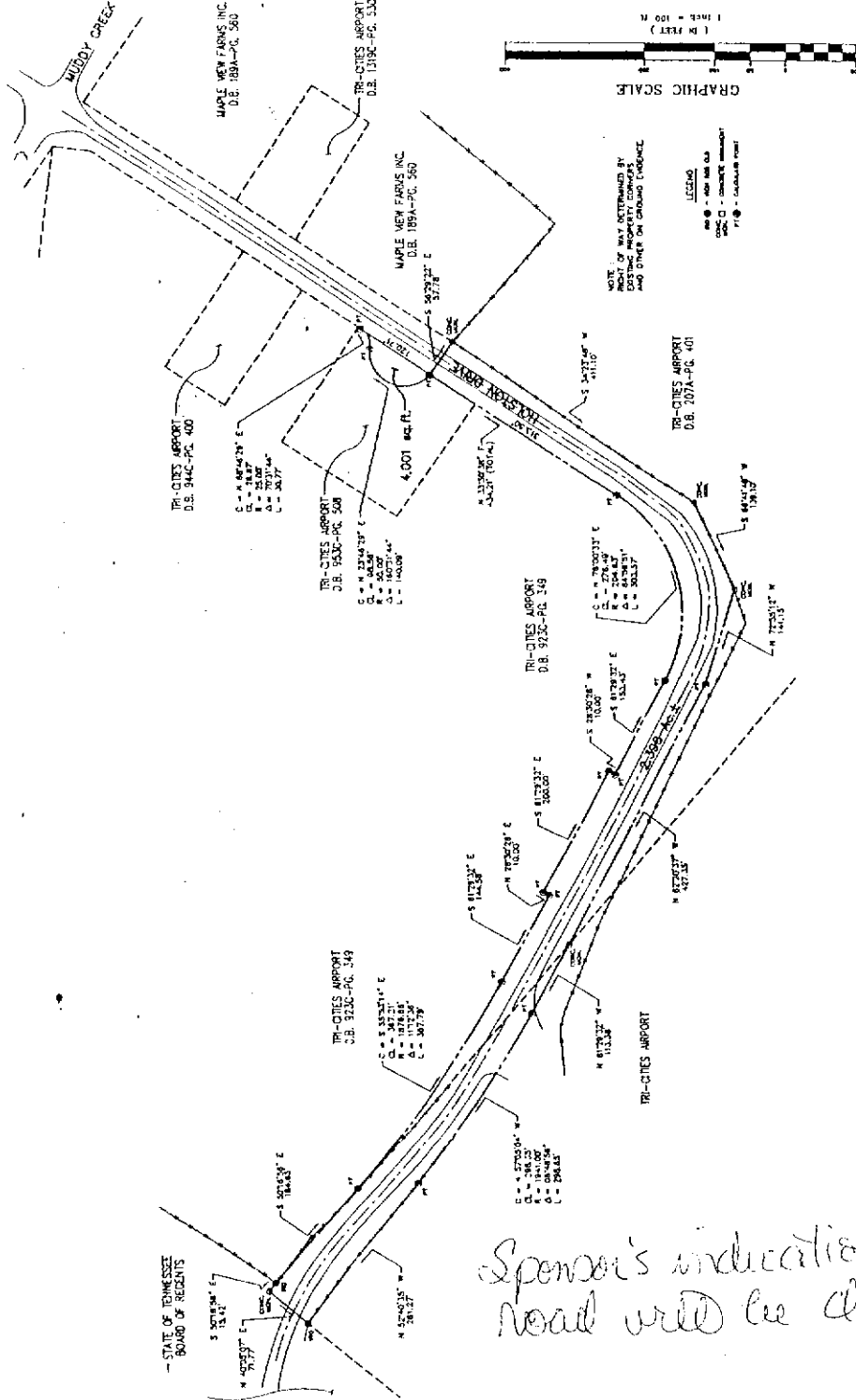

- The Taxiway B and drainage improvements projects should begin in mid-June with completion due in August.
- Design of the Runway 5 Safety Area Extension has been completed. Application for discretionary funding has been submitted to the FAA and approval is expected in August.
- Design of the terminal concourse expansion project is on schedule and should be completed by late June or July.
- A full scale Emergency Exercise Drill has been scheduled for August 7. This year's drill will include a terminal response element which will allow the airlines to exercise their emergency plans for dealing with victims' families and the media.

Mr. Hanlin reported that our new fuel facilities will accommodate tanker trucks making deliveries to the tanks, and there is no danger of trucks projecting into the roadway during the process. He also addressed concerns regarding location of the fire hydrant. Because water to the site was needed for shower/eye wash use for any contamination by fuel it was decided to expand the size of the line and install a hydrant at that time. Neither that hydrant nor the one located inside the airport perimeter fence nearby was ever intended for fighting a fuel farm fire, since chemical agents, not water, are used to suppress a fuel fire.

Mr. Hanlin reported that he has discussed the closing of Holston Drive with Gill Hodges and also with Sam Jones, a Sullivan County Commissioner whose district included the ~~for~~ the Airport. A formal request has been made to Sullivan County to participate in the expense of constructing a connector road to Fain Drive. Mr. Mahoney suggests that we formally request that ownership of Holston Drive be transferred to the Airport Commission.

14. Upon a motion made by Mr. Mahoney and seconded by Mr. Gillenwater, the following was adopted: BE IT RESOLVED that the Tri-Cities Airport Commission shall submit a formal notification to Sullivan County requesting transfer of ownership from the County to the Airport Commission of the portion of Holston Drive located from the Northeast State Technical Community College property (State of Tennessee) to Muddy Creek Road.

The motion was passed unanimously.
