On October 16, 2003, the Kingsport Regional Planning Commission made the following recommendation concerning the county case:

10-01 335 Arcadia Drive County Rezoning Request (03-101-00012)

The county rezoning request of approximately 21-aeres from R1, Residential District to A1, Agricultural District was located adjacent to the eastern side of 335 Arcadia Drive accessed from East Stone Drive (Sullivan County tax map 32, part of parcel 128, 128.20). The proposal was to convert a house and barn currently being constructed into a landscaping business specializing in fishponds. Staff recommended the rezoning as requested for the following reasons:

- It is compatible with the northern farms, and the surrounding large lots that are either detached single-family houses, or vacant.
- 2. The proposed zoning can be accommodated by existing services such as the increased traffic on East Stone Drive.

Two unnamed neighbors opposed the rezoning based upon the poor southern sight distance of Arçadia Drive, which curved near the site, and its narrow street pavement width, which caused accidents in the area. Staff stated if the 21-acre property were developed as presently zoned into a residential subdivision, the amount of traffic generated would be comparable to the specialized hydro-landscaping business. The property owner and applicant, Lynn Hicks, stated that the sight distance was adequate. On a motion by Colette George, seconded by Doug Releford, the Commission voted unanimously, 5-0, to recommend the rezoning as requested based upon the Staff rationale.

Sullivan County.

EXISTING LAND USE:

Vacant.

PROPOSED USE:

For future aguascape business (unspecified).

#### COMPARISONS BETWEEN COUNTY R1 & A1 ZONING DISTRICTS:

- R1 is primarily for single-family residences on minimum 15,000 square-foot lots.
- At is primarily for agricultural purposes, but also permits all R1 land uses.

#### SURROUNDING COUNTY ZONING

The property is surrounded by county R1 zoning districts with the city R-1B, detached single-family zoning district to the southeast.

#### SURROUNDING LAND USES.

North: There are agricultural farms on both sides of Arcadia Drive directly to the north, and two detached single-family houses with horses

South: Directly south, there is a vacant 16-acre lot adjacent to Arcadia Drive. The land uses adjacent to Arcadia Drive between the site and East Stone Drive comprise of mostly single-family houses, vacant lots, and near the intersection General Shale Brick Block, Leonard Truck Accessories, and one 32-acre farm.

East: Vacant woods.

West: Detached single-family house on 17-acres.

#### LAND USE PLAN (S):

 The 2010 Conceptual Land Use Plan (<u>Kingsport Land Use Plan</u>, 1988) designates the property for single-family land use.

UTILITIES: City sewer is not available to the property. The property is located within the jurisdiction of Bloomingdale Water.

#### TRANSPORTATION:

Arcadia Drive has an approximately 18-to-20-foot 2-lane pavement width. The Major Street & Road Plan (2000) designates East Stone Drive between New Beason Well Road, and the Eastern City limits as a principle arterial street with a 180-foot right-of-way. The Tennessee state station 109 counted 16,747 average daily vehicle trips on East Stone Drive located near its intersection with Arcadia Drive. This vehicle count has decreased 2,277 daily trips since 1994, which had 14,470 daily vehicle trips. Thus, East Stone Drive can adequately handle additional traffic.

#### PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS:

The property measures approximately 64-feet of lot frontage adjacent to Arcadia Drive, and it widens to approximately 20-feet in the rear. The property has varying topography over its 21-acres.

RESOLUTION TO CALL A REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF WHETHER A COUNTY-WIDE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX SHOULD BE LEVIED FOR SULLIVAN COUNTY

**WHEREAS,** *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 5-8-102, authorizes counties to levy and have approved by a majority of the number of qualified voters of the county voting in an election on the question of whether or not the tax should be levied, a motor vehicle privilege tax as a condition precedent to the operation of a motor vehicle within a county; and,

WHEREAS, the need for new revenue sources is great in Sullivan County;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby approves:

**SECTION 1.** For the privilege of using the public roads and highways, in Sullivan County, Tennessee, there is levied upon motor-driven vehicles, and upon the privilege of the operation thereof, except motorcycles, motor-driven bicycles and scooters, farm tractors, self-propelled farm machines not usually used for operation upon public highways or roads, and motor-driven vehicles owned by any governmental agency or governmental instrumentality and except for other exemptions provided by general law, a special privilege tax for the benefit of such county, which tax shall be in the amount of \$26.00 for each such motor-driven vehicle, the owner of which resides within said county.

**SECTION 2.** The tax herein levied shall be paid to and collected by the County Clerk of Sullivan County, who is authorized by *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-4-103, to collect such privilege taxes. The County Clerk shall collect this tax at the same time he or she collects the state privilege tax levied upon the operation of a motor-driven vehicle over the public highways of this State. The County Clerk shall deduct a fee of five percent (5%) as authorized in *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 8-21-701(55), from the amount of taxes collected and paid over to the Trustee.

**SECTION 3.** Payment of the privilege tax imposed hereunder shall be evidenced by a receipt, issued in duplicate by the County Clerk, the original of which shall be kept by the owner of the motor-driven vehicle, and by a decal also issued by the County Clerk, which shall be displayed by affixing the decal on and to the lower right corner of the license plate in the space provided for such decal. The design of the decal shall be determined by the County Clerk being one inch (1") in height and have a width of one-half inch (1/2"), the same size as the present state renewal decal. The expense incident to the purchase of such decals herein required, as well as the expense of obtaining proper receipts and other records necessary for the performance of the duties herein incumbent upon the County Clerk shall be paid from the General Fund of the

**SECTION 4.** The privilege tax or wheel tax herein levied, when paid together with full, complete and explicit performance of and compliance with all provisions of the Resolutions, by the owner, shall entitle the owner of the motor-driven vehicle for which said tax was paid on and which the decal has been affixed as herein provided, to operate or allow to be operated his vehicle over the streets, roads, and highways of the county for a period of one year, which will run concurrently with the period established for the state registration fees by *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 55-4-104.

In the event the wheel tax decal is sold by the County Clerk for a period of more or less than a calendar year, the tax imposed shall be proportionate to the annual tax fixed for the vehicle and modified in no other manner, except that the proportional tax shall be rounded off to the nearest quarter of a dollar.

**SECTION 5.** In the event any motor-driven vehicle for which the wheel tax has been paid and the emblem or decal issued and placed thereon, becomes unusable, obliterated, erased or defaced, or is destroyed or damaged to the extent that it can no longer be operated over the public roads, streets or highways of said county; or in the event that the owner transfers the title to the vehicle, and completely removes there from and destroys the decal or emblem issued for and placed thereon, and the owner makes proper application to the County Clerk for the issuance of a duplicate decal to be used by the owner for the unexpired term for which the original decal was issued, and the County Clerk is satisfied that the applicant is entitled to the issuance of such a duplicate decal and the owner pays the County Clerk the sum of \$3.00, the County will then issue to such owner a duplicate receipt, canceling the original receipt delivered to the owner by the County Clerk, and a duplicate decal shall be provided to be affixed as outlined above.

**SECTION 6.** The proceeds of this tax shall be deposited in the Highway Fund of Sullivan County, and to the incorporated Cities within Sullivan County a prorate share of the monthly collections based upon the certified road miles of each jurisdiction within Sullivan County.

**SECTION 7.** This Resolution shall have no effect unless it is approved by a majority of the number of qualified voters of Sullivan County, Tennessee, voting in an election on the question of whether or not the tax should be approved. The county election commission, upon passage of this Resolution, shall call an election on the question of whether or not the wheel tax should be levied to be held in the a special election after this request has been certified by the County Clerk to the Sullivan County Election Commission, with the ballots having printed on them the substance of this Resolution. The voters shall vote for or against the approval of this Resolution and the result of such referendum certified by the county election commission to the county legislative body. The cost of the election shall paid by Sullivan

**SECTION 8.** For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Resolution, it shall be effective upon being approved by a majority of the members of the Sullivan County Legislative Body, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, this Resolution shall take effect upon approval as provided in Section 7.

RESOLUTION Requesting Tennessee General Assembly to Pass Legislation Requiring Teens to Attend Preventive and Defensive Driving Class Prior to Obtaining Tennessee Driver's License

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office has worked 14 fatalities from January 1, 2002 to August 29, 2003. There were a total of 16 people fatally injured in these crashes. Of the 16 fatally injured, 7 were under 21 years of age. Of those 7 under 21 years of age, 3 were under the influence of alcohol, 1 was under the influence of drugs and 4 were not wearing a seatbelt; and

WHEREAS, there were 355 alcohol related fatalities on Tennessee highways in 2002 which equates to 30.16% of fatal crashes in 2002 (1,177 total fatalities); and

WHEREAS, there were 704 fatalities on Tennessee highways in 2001 that were not wearing seatbelts. This compares to 293 that were wearing restraints; and

WHEREAS, there were 2,281 incapacitating injuries on Tennessee highways in 2001 that were not wearing seatbelts; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Human Resource Agency has agreed to implement classes throughout the 95 counties of Tennessee to teach a 4-hour course that will be pro-active in saving lives on our highways. The price for this class will be \$35.00 per participant. Each participant will be responsible for this expense. For those that are not able to pay this fee, there will be grant money that will be made available; and

WHEREAS, with the passing of this Resolution, it will be forwarded to Nashville recommending for the Legislature to pass a state law mandating for all teenagers to attend this class prior to getting their Tennessee drivers license. A certificate will be awarded each participant. They will present this certificate at the time of testing for a license. The participants can also turn a copy of this certificate in to their respective insurance companies for a possible reduction in auto rates; and

WHEREAS, this program is designed to increase teen awareness of driving while intoxicated, the benefits from wearing seatbelts, how speed increases the chance of death, and to reduce fatalities and incapacitating injuries on our highways.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, hereby request the Tennessee General Assembly to pass legislation requiring all teenagers in the State of Tennessee to attend a 4-hour course, as outlined above, prior to obtaining a Tennessee driver's license.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon passage of this Resolution the County Mayor's Office shall forward a copy of same to the Sullivan County legislative delegates for their consideration and presentation to the full Tennessee General Assembly.



RESOLUTION To Amend The No Child Left Behind Legislation Of The U. S. Department of Education Relative To Special Education, Graduation Rate, 95% Rule Of Participation, Highly Qualified Teachers, And Paraprofessionals

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Education and Board of County Commissioners recognize the importance and value of a statewide system of fair accountability, and,

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Education and Board of County Commissioners do not wish to allow this school district to become less accountable, and,

WHEREAS, requirements of the No Child Left Behind legislation as they relate to the Adequate Yearly Progress within the Special Education population proficiency levels, Graduation Rate component, 95% Rule Of Participation, Highly Qualified Teachers, and Paraprofessionals are seriously flawed and unrealistic, and,

WHEREAS, No Child Left Behind requires all students to be assessed and further requires that Special Education students be assessed through standardized testing or portfolio or alternate assessment, and requires Special Education students with an IQ of 60 to achieve proficiency on standardized tests, with 100% reaching proficiency in 2013-2014. This requirement, with no leniency, adds undeserved stress relative to the rigorous training to attempt meeting this mandate, and.

WHEREAS, No Child Left Behind requires that in 2013-2014, all high school graduates must attain a regular high school diploma during four years and one summer, and,

WHEREAS, many students enter into a productive career through other graduation programs and receive credentials, such as GED, GED+2, or Special Education Diploma, but will not count in this calculation for purposes of No Child Left Behind, and,

WHEREAS, the 95% Rule of Participation is not an acceptable requirement because it does not take into account episodes of influenza and other events of unpredictable occurrence, and,

WHEREAS, requirements relative to Highly Qualified Teachers further negatively impact specific teacher shortages, such as Special Education and middle schools, that are already in shortage; and implicates comprehensive measures to maintain highly qualified professional personnel in this school district. Loss of professional personnel in Sullivan County Schools is a potential outcome from the options to become highly qualified due to 33% of professional staffing having 25+ years of employment, and,

WHEREAS, requirements relative to Paraprofessionals becoming qualified do not consider experience, which is a valued characteristic of these employees, and,

WHEREAS, human and material resources for schools have not been allocated from federal sources to assist targeted schools with recovery in Sullivan County Schools, and,

WHEREAS, to implement School Choice, present Title I guidelines require a holdback of 20% funding to accommodate possible requests for school change. This holdback dramatically reduces funding for personnel who work with the Title I program. Any additional funding beyond this 20% must be funded locally, and,

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Education and Board of County Commissioners believe amendments relative to Special Education, Graduation Rate, 95% Rule Of Participation, Highly Qualified Teachers, And Paraprofessionals, are appropriate and necessary for more adequate implementation of No Child Left Behind legislation, and, attainment of Adequate Yearly Progress in these areas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, hereby submit a request for amendments to federal legislative requirements as they relate to regulations of Special Education, Graduation Rate, 95% Rule Of Participation, Highly Qualified Teachers, And Paraprofessionals serving under No Child Left Behind to rectify these flaws.

# RESOLUTION Authorization Allocation of Funds to Proceed with Mitigation Plan on Bristol Caverns Highway

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners approved Resolution No. 4 on February 18, 2002, a copy of which is attached hereto, requesting the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to provide a mitigation plan for residents of the Holston Valley Community; and

WHEREAS, FEMA has approved a mitigation plan for two residential properties located on Bristol Caverns Highway (1647 Bristol Caverns Highway and 1671 Bristol Caverns Highway); and

WHEREAS, both property owners have elected to participate in the mitigation program and have agreed to accept the appraised value as the purchase price for said properties; and

WHEREAS, the total cost to purchase both properties and complete demolition of all structures thereon has been estimated at \$126,800.00; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County will be required to advance the full cost of this project at the time of acquisition and demolition; however, FEMA will reimburse Sullivan County for seventy-five percent (75%) of the total cost expended thereby leaving Sullivan County's share of twenty-five percent (25%) at a cost not to exceed \$31,700.00;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, hereby allocate the sum of \$126,800.00 to be utilized for the acquisition and demolition of the above-referenced properties included in the mitigation plan approved by FEMA on Bristol Caverns Highway with seventy-five percent (75%) to be reimbursed to Sullivan County by FEMA. Account codes to be assigned by the Director of Accounts and Budgets.
