### **INTRODUCTION**

Consider recommending the proposed Sullivan County zoning text amendments to the Sullivan County Commission.

#### **PRESENTATION**

On August 15, 2005, the Sullivan County Commission requested that the Kingsport Regional Planning Commission reconsider Item G-2 — Revised Text Amendment on Temporary Storage of Equipment In All Zones. This proposal recommends allowance of temporary storage of construction and earth moving equipment on A-1 properties of 5 acres of more. After discussion revised text was agreed upon by the members to further define the intent and purpose of this text amendment:

"Section I of Appendix B-107 — Temporary Uses Permitted — To assist small business owners of earth moving equipment, the temporary storage of no more that ten (10 pieces of earth moving equipment and their necessary carriers, shall be allowed on parcels zoned agricultural (A-1 and A-2 only) that are five (5) acres or more in areas for a time period not to exceed ninety (90) consecutive days and no more that ninety (90) days in any calendar year. "

The City of Kingsport permits storage of such equipment in only the industrial zones. Equipment cannot be stored in any residential zone. Attached is a chart comparing existing codes.

#### **OPTIONS**

The Planning Commission's options are as follows:

1. Recommend the zoning amendments to the Sullivan County Commission.

- 2. Deny approval and state the reasons for denial in writing.
- 3. Postpone action pending receipt of additional information.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Option 2. **Deny approval** for the following reasons:

- 1. Enforcement will be too difficult given existing manpower.
- 2. The possibility for abuse would be too great in that the five acres could be subdivided and stored equipment may be considered grand fathered causing non-conformity to this ordinance and creating legal issues.

# KINGSPORT MALL REDEVELOPMENT DISTRICT REDEVELOPMENT PLAN AMENDMENT #2

WHEREAS, since the date of adoption of a Redevelopment Plan for the Kingsport Mall Redevelopment District and subsequent Tax Increment Financing Amendment thereto, certain developments have made it advantageous to amend said Redevelopment Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Redevelopment Plan for the Kingsport Mall Redevelopment District is hereby amended as follows:

1. Paragraph A of the Tax Increment Financing Amendment is hereby deleted and replaced in its entirety as follows:

#### A. Estimated Cost of the Project.

The total estimated costs of all the proposed improvements to be made by Roger Ball & Carroll E. Rose, LLC (the "Developer") as Developer for the East Stone Commons Project, is \$ 18,300,000.00 ("Proposed Improvements"). Improvements include a retail shopping center and related amenities consisting of approximately 277,650 square feet as well as items of public improvement. public improvement include the relocation and placement of utilities for the project, the widening and dedication of a street along the easterly side of the project, landscaping, rehabilitation of existing structures, demolition of the current dilapidated structures located upon the property, removal of refuse and demolition material from the site, and numerous other items. One Hundred Ninety Five Thousand Dollars (\$195,000.00) shall be allocated to Kingsport Housing & Redevelopment Authority ("KHRA") from the TIF for reimbursement of expenses related to the East Stone Commons Project with the remaining balance being used for Greenbelt Improvements within the Project Area. In addition, the KHRA will be paid a redevelopment services fee equal to two percent of the final TIF indebtedness. The East Stone Commons Project will be located upon the following property which shall be referred to as the "Project Area":

- 1. Lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 of a Plat titled East Stone Commons recorded on December 28, 2004 in Plat Book 51, Page 802 in the Sullivan County Register's Office at Blountville, Tennessee ("East Stone Commons Plat").
- 2. The future street to be dedicated known as Indian Trail as shown on the East Stone Commons Plat and any extension thereof.
- 3. All property within the Redevelopment District owned by the City of Kingsport or the Kingsport Housing & Redevelopment Authority, all of which is property commonly referred to as the "Greenbelt" or adjacent thereto. See the following deeds of record in the Sullivan County Register's Office at Blountville, Tennessee for a detailed description of said property: Deed Book 801C, Page 775; Deed Book 1042C, Page 1; Deed Book 967C, Page 725; Deed Book 2283C, Page 264; and Deed Book 2283C, Page 271.

The TIF shall be limited to the Project Area.

2. Paragraph C of the Tax Increment Financing Amendment is hereby deleted and replaced in its entirety as follows:

#### C. Amount and Final Maturity of Indebtedness to be Incurred.

The final maturity date on indebtedness backed by the tax-increment from eligible properties shall be on or before June 30, 2022. Upon retirement of all bonds, loans, or other indebtedness incurred and payable from tax-increment funds, or at such time as monies on deposit in the tax-increment fund or funds are sufficient for such purpose, all property taxes resulting from the incremental development of the project shall be retained by the appropriate taxing agency for disbursement according to law.

3. Paragraph J of the Tax Increment Financing Amendment is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

#### J. Conditions of Tax-Increment.

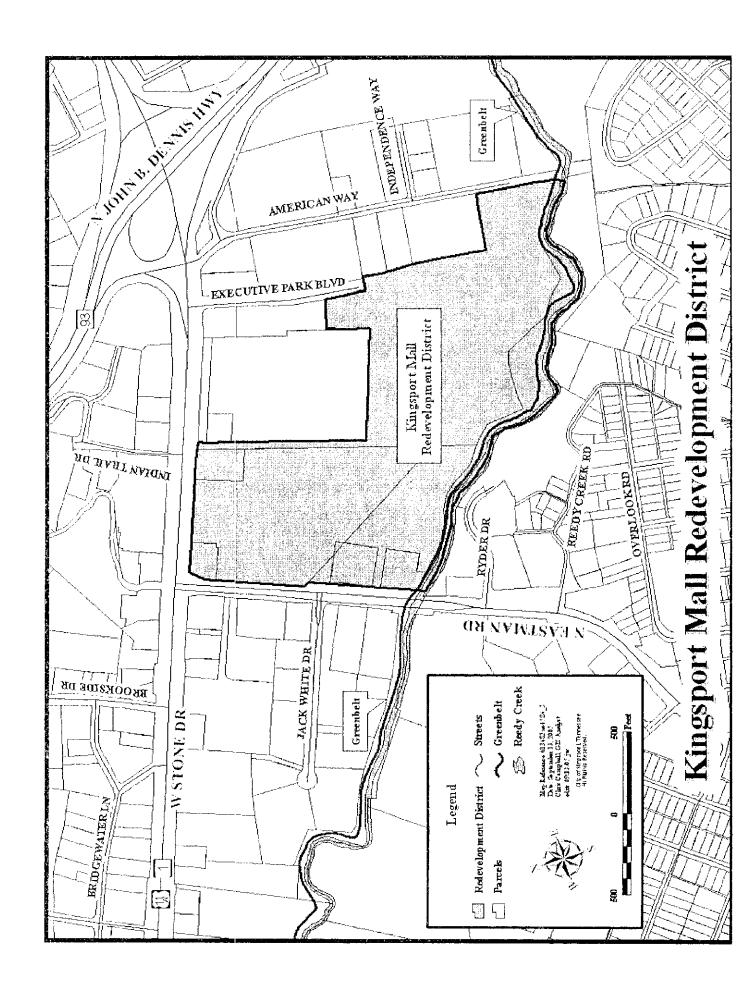
The KHRA shall enter into a Redevelopment Agreement with Developer which requires Developer to complete all of the Proposed Improvements other than improvements on Lot 4 of the East Stone Commons Plat (the former Montgomery Wards Auto Center) prior to June 30, 2006, in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the KHRA. No TIF funds shall be released by the KHRA until satisfactory completion of all Proposed Improvements by Developer and the satisfaction of such other terms and conditions as the KHRA may deem necessary to the satisfactory completion of the Project. The Redevelopment Agreement to be entered into between the KHRA and Developer shall contain such terms as the KHRA believes reasonably necessary to accomplish this purpose.

4. Paragraph K of the Tax Increment Financing Amendment Is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

#### K. Miscellaneous Amendments.

The boundary for the Kingsport Mall Redevelopment District is revised by this amendment to include all property shown on Exhibit B hereto. In addition, any references to urban renewal or urban renewal plan are hereby deleted from the Redevelopment Plan for the Kingsport Mall Redevelopment District.
