PURPOSES OF 1981 AND 1957 CENTRALIZED FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT ACTS 0625

The primary goal of the 1981 and 1957 centralized financial management acts was to authorize counties to establish a uniform financial management system similar to businesses, the state and city governments. Other purposes or objectives of the two acts are:

- 1. Establishment of one accounting, budgeting, and purchasing department for a county.
- 2. One finance department so that counties can afford to hire a trained technician in the area of finance. It would be too costly to hire a trained technician for the school department, one for the highway department, and one for the general operations.
- 3. Adoption and implementation of uniform financial policies and practices for all departments.
- 4. Implementation of sound purchasing techniques and cost saving practices.
- 5. A department that can evaluate cost and revenue sources and provide alternatives and priorities.
- Capability for providing more accurate, timely financial reports thereby creating a
 more business like image to the taxpayers and voters than the present fragmented
 system.
- 7. One person is responsible for long-range financial planning for capital improvements and funding of the improvements for the entire county.
- 8. Cash forecasting and cash flow management can be improved thereby increasing interest income or reducing interest cost.
- 9. An experienced and trained person with business like and problem-solving abilities can be employed to work with the different personalities in the county government.
- 10. A neutral department that works with the county commission and other county officials.
- 11. Better management of a large budget and accounting system that produces accurate and timely reports.
- 12. Implementation of a budgeting system that provides adequate facts to the county commission and board of education as well as other county officials, thus helping them to allocate resources, establish priorities, and adopt a financially accurate budget.

COUNTY PINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM OF 1981 (Alternative to the 1957 Fiscal Control Acts)

Reference: T.C.A. 5-21-101 through 5-21-129 or Public Chapter 325 of 1981

A. MAJOR FEATURES

- 1. Uniform, centralized management of county finances through accounting, budgeting, payroll, purchasing, cash management for all departments with funds handled by the County Trustes.
 - General Pund
 - в. Debt Sarvice Funds
 - C. Revenue Sharing Fund
 - D. Road Fund
 - E. Education Funds
 - P. Others
- 2. Provides for the hiring of a trained technician in the area of accounting or finance (18 quarter hours in accounting) (Director of Finance)
- Seven member committee (County Financial Committee) made up of the county executive/judge, highway supervisor/superintendent, superintendent of aducation and four mambers appointed by the county legislative body (either members or non-members). This committee is responsible for policies, procedures, and regulations for operating the system as well as hiring the director of finance.
- 4. Finance Department with the director of finance as the supervisor and responsible for managing the county finances.
- 5. Deputy Director of Finance to serve in the absence of the director.
- 6. County legislative body may authorize the County Financial Committee to serve as the investment, budget, and/or purchasing committees of the county.
- 7. All personnel handling county finances are to be bonded.
- 8. General procedures are included in the law for:
 - A. Budgeting
 - B. Fiscal management (accounting)

 - C. Payroll D. Furchasing
 - E. Signing verrents
 - F. Impounding of funds
 - G. Paying of invoices H. Issuance of purchase
 - Issuance of purchase orders and contracts
 - I. Removal of the education department if proper procedures are not followed

- Monthly financial report required for each department head, elected
 official and board member. Also, the most recent report is to be
 presented to the county legislative body at each regular session.
- 10. Obligation Accounting: the accounting records and budgetary condition are to reflect all purchase orders and obligations outstanding.

B. COST TO IMPLEMENT SYSTEM

There are four factors affecting the cost to establish the System:

- Present cost of finance personnel, supplies, equipment, and office space.
- Increased cost resulting from adding the director, equipment, services, and office space. Estimated salary of a director would be from \$18,000 to \$35,000.
- Decrease in cost from reduction in personnel and duplication as well as savings from better purchasing and management.
- Increase in investment income from better cash management and investment program. \$14,000 per \$100,000 in additional investments.

Usually the present personnel, supplies and aquipment are sufficient to operate the system except for the cost of the director and any changes which need to be made. However, with improved purchasing, cash management, and interest income, the increased cost would be more than offset from savings and additional income.

C. BENEFITS FROM THE SYSTEM

The net benefit to the county is a centralized, uniform financial management system with continuity and expertise. However, there are specific benefits:

- 1. Good purchasing techniques are used.
- Alternatives to cost increases and revenue sources can be evaluated better with full-time financial capability.
- The county demonstrates business techniques, and thereby, creating a more business like image to the taxpayers and voters than the present fragmented system.
- Long-range planning for capital improvements with full-time financial capability can be implemented.
- The business technique of cash management can benefit the county in many ways.

D. HOW TO INSTALL THE SYSTEM

The "County Financial Management System Act of 1981" is a local option Act that can be installed in a county either by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body or by a majority of the voters in an election.

After ratification of the Act by a county, four members in addition to the county executive/judge, highway supervisor, and superintendent of education must be appointed to the County Financial Management Committee.

Then a Director of Finance must be hired and the Finance Department established.

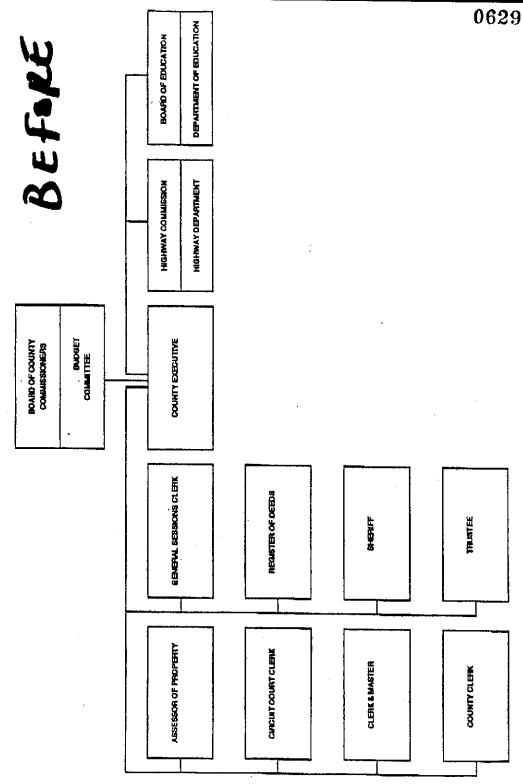
Upon this action a plan of implementation should be developed to phase in the finance personnel of the various departments and eliminate the present fragmented system.

The law provides for one fiscal year and the following July to completely implement the system. This gives time for budget amendments, the moving of personnel and the implementation of financial system changes.

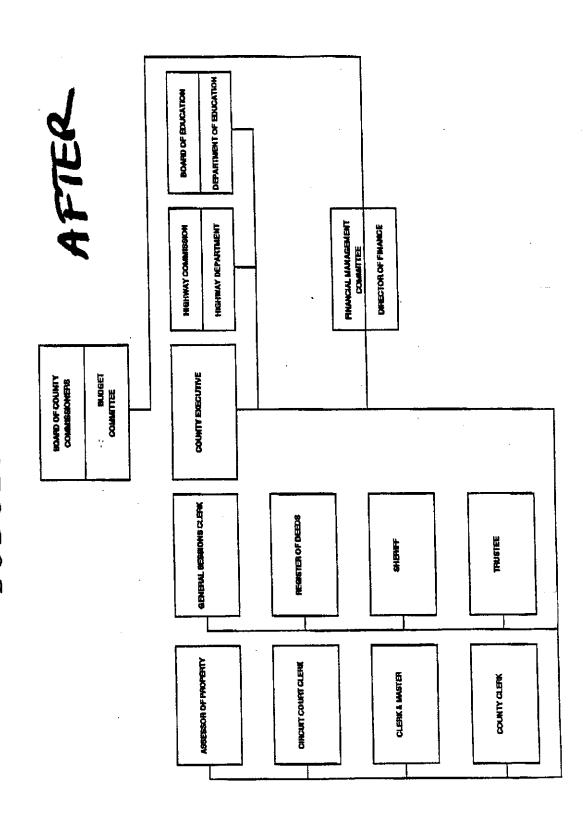
2. KEYS TO SUCCESS

- The first key is the quality and determination of the four (4) members appointed by the county legislative body to the County Financial Management Committee.
- The second key to success is the quality, personality, ability and training of the Director of Finance.
- 3. The third key to success is the support and working relationship of the three department heads and the county commission that develops with the Finance Department and Director of Finance.
- 4. The fourth key is the ability to say "No" by the committee and Director yet have the patience to get through the first year without alienation from the rest of the county and deterioration of support from the county commission. It is best to go slow but very firm in good business procedures.

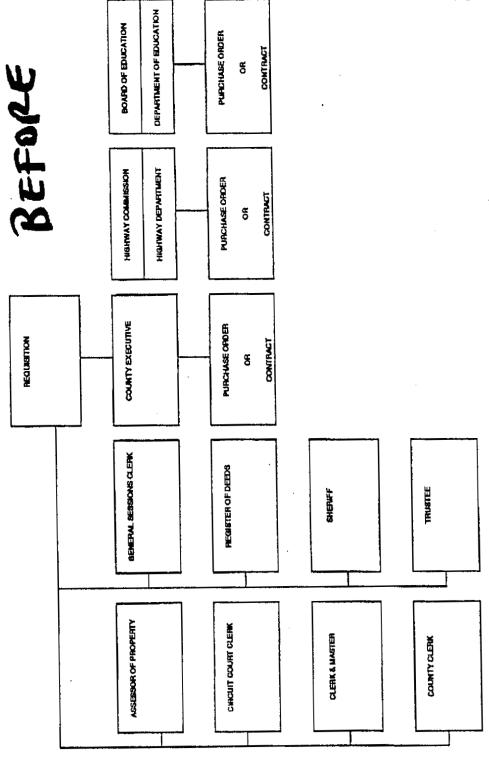
BUDGET FUNCTION

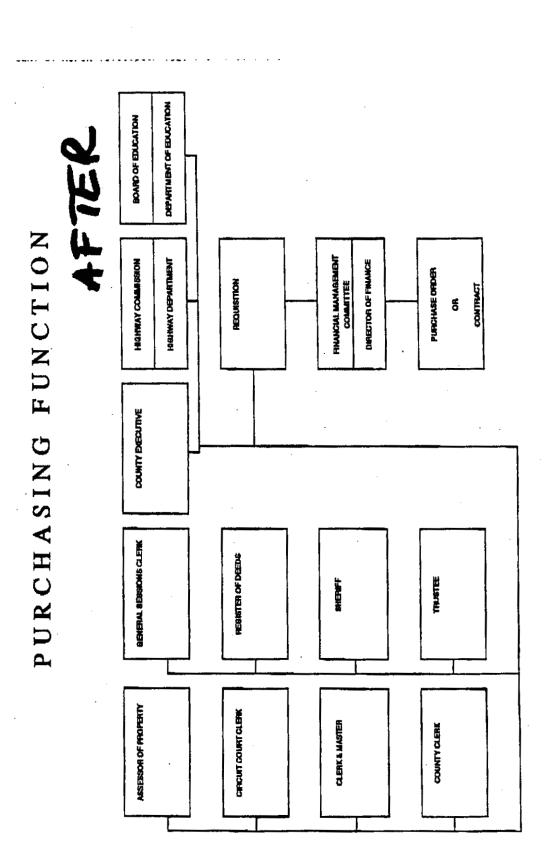


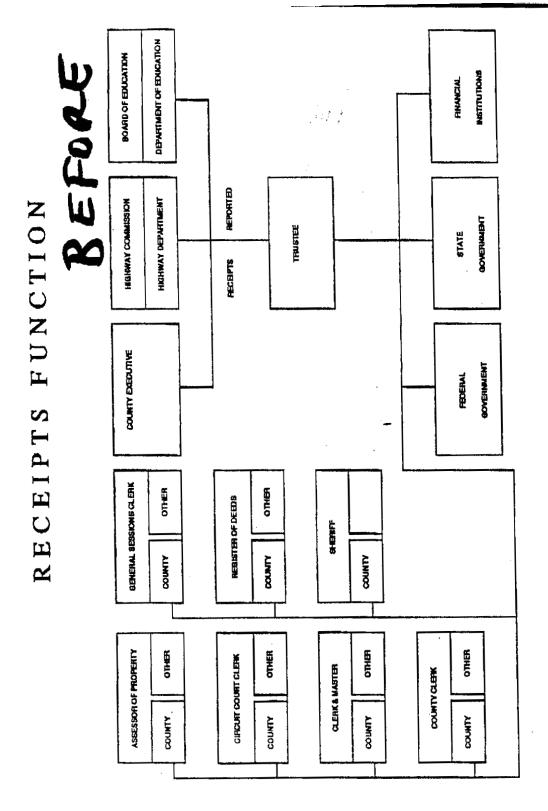
BUDGET FUNCTION



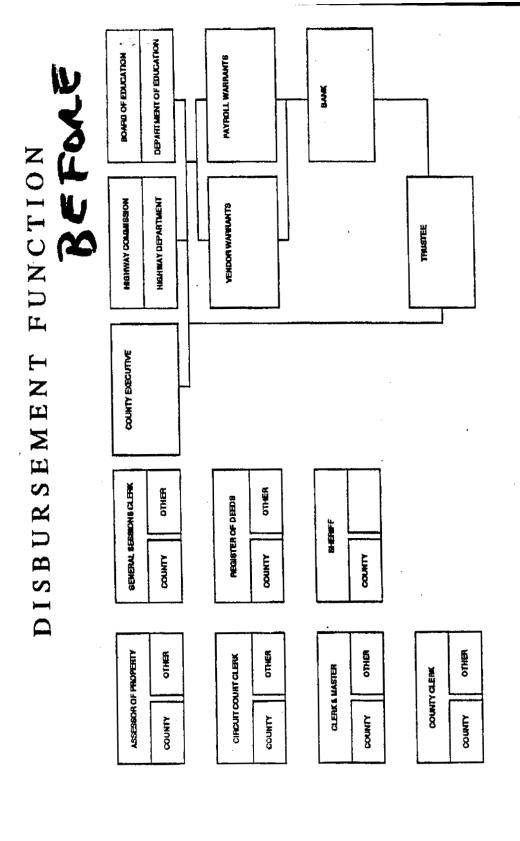
PURCHASING FUNCTION

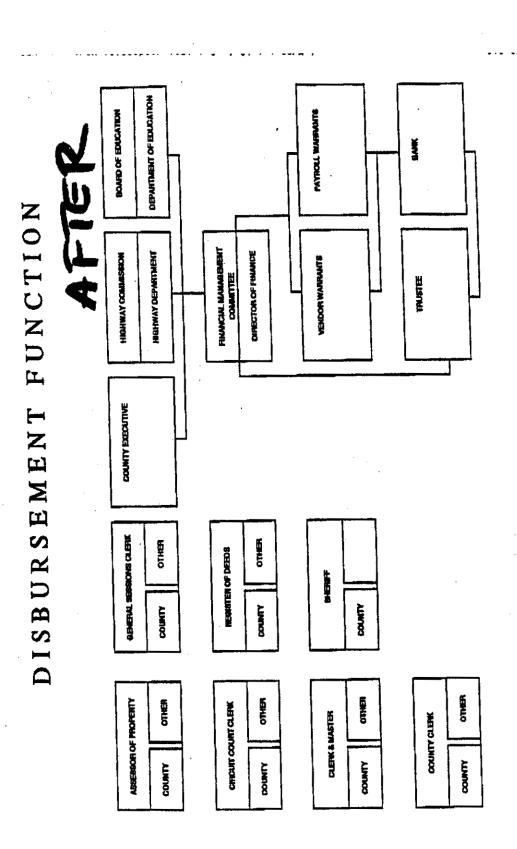
