Agenda Item No. N-5: Rezoning - Cynthia Leonard - 268 George Carr Road from R-1, low-density residential district to R-2, medium density residential district

Background: Ms. Cynthia Leonard is requesting Planning Commission approval for the rezoning of a one acre tract of land located at 268 George Carr Road from R-1, low-density residential district, to the proposed zoning designation R-2, medium density residential district. The property is currently zoned (Sullivan County zoning designation) R-1, low-density residential district. The property contained in this request is Parcel 38.0 as shown on the 1998 Sullivan County Tax Map 68. The purpose of this request is to allow a single wide mobile home to remain in place that was constructed in the absence of a building permit. The owner of the property is Cynthia Leonard.

<u>Analysis:</u> The request is located near the intersection of Buncombe Road and George Carr Road. The predominant zoning in the surrounding area is R-1 (low density residential), A-1 (general agricultural) and M-2 (high impact district). Directly abutting the property on the north is R-1 zoning, on the south is M-2, on the east is R-1 zoning and on the west is R-1 zoning. Existing land use in the surrounding area is a mixture of agricultural use, single family residences and vacant land. Currently, the site is contains one residential structure. All affected property owners have been informed of the request. One item of concern have been identified via staff review:

1. Spot zoning is not permitted. If the rezoning benefits the single individual and will not serve the overall interest of the County, it should not be approved.

<u>Recommendation</u>: It is staff recommendation that the request to rezone property from R-1 to R-2 district for the purpose of placing a single-wide mobile-home be given an unfavorable recommendation to the Sullivan County Commission. The Story Story

Bagroundek: Mr. Ronnie Rose is requesting Planning Commission approval for the rezoning of a 1.784 acre tract of land located at 1640 Vance Tank Road from R-1, low-density residential district, to the proposed zoning designation B-3, general business. The property is currently zoned (Sullivan County zoning designation) R-1, low-density residential district. The property contained in this request is Parcel 7.0 as shown on the 1998 Sullivan County Tax Map 68. The purpose of this request is to allow a transmission shop and retail business establishments. The owner of the property is Ronnie Rose.

Analysis: The request is located near the intersection of Vance Tank Road and State Route 394. The property is also adjacent to the Bristol Tennessee Corporate Limits. The existing zoning in the area is predominantly R-1 (low density residential) and A-1 (general agricultural). Existing land use in the surrounding area is a mixture of agricultural use, single family residences and vacant land. Currently, the site **E** contains three residential structures. All affected property owners have been informed of the request. Two items of concern have been identified via staff review:

- 1. Spot zoning is not permitted. If the rezoning benefits the single individual and will not serve the overall interest of the County, it should not be approved
- 2. The proposed request would not be in character with the surrounding neighborhood.

Recommendation: It is staff's opinion that Mt. Rose's request to allow a transmission shop and retail business establishments would not be in character with the surrounding neighborhood. Staff recommends that this request be given an unfavorable recommendation to the Sullivan County Commissioner.

Requested Action:	County rezoning of 4.07 acres from R-1, (Low Density) Residential District, to B-1, (Neighborhood) Business District. The property lies outside the Kingsport city limits in the 11 th Civil District of Sullivan County.
Location:	2117 Bloomingdale Pike, at the corner of Bloomingdale Pike and Brooklawn Drive; Tax Map 31-H.
Existing Land Use:	Single-family residence on east portion; grazing land for horses on west portion.
Proposed Use:	Bed & breakfast (no site plan yet submitted). County zoning regulations require parking and buffer plans before proposed use is adopted. Western portion of land will retain current use.
Surrounding Sulliva	an County Zoning and Land Use:
North:	R-1, (Low Density) Residential District - 5.1 acres, containing a church; B-3, (General) Business District - 3.54 acres, containing several automotive-repair and maintenance facilities.
South:	R-1, (Low Density) Residential District - three lots, center lot vacant, east and west lots each containing one single-family home.
East:	R-1, (Low Density) Residential District - two lots, each containing one single-family home.
West:	R-1, (Low Density) Residential District - 20.3 acres, vacant with the exception of two non-adjacent single-family homes with Bloomingdale Road frontage.
Land Use Plan:	Land Use Plan 2010 (1988) designates this area for single-family use.

- Utilities: A six-inch water line runs adjacent to the property. The house is served by a ¾ inch water line, which is adequate for the proposed use. Other uses permitted under B-1 zoning, such as a grocery store or laundromat, may require upgrading the line. Sewer is not available.
- **Transportation:** The property fronts on Bloomingdale Road, which is designated a minor arterial. Lot frontage on Bloomingdale Road is ~450 feet. Increased traffic as a result of rezoning should be accommodated safely. The property is currently accessed by a circle drive whose western half has fallen into disuse. Due to vegetation on the western portion of the property, as well as limited sight distance due to the cresting of the hill, staff recommends that if the circle drive is to be fully utilized in the future the western entrance should be restricted to ingress only. The property owner has signaled his willingness to cooperate in this matter. A site plan addressing this issue, among others, will be required before the proposed use is adopted.

Physical Characteristics:

The property is ~4 acres. Lot frontage on Bloomingdale Road is approximately 450 feet. Lot depth is approximately 370 feet, though this varies. The eastern portion of the property, on which the house is located, is cleared and mostly level. To the west the topography becomes steeper, descending into a depression. A pond and what appears to be a springhouse are located at the bottom. Continuing west, the ground climbs again until it is nearly level with Brooklawn Drive. A number of accessory structures are located throughout the western area, most in a state of disrepair. The western portion is mostly overgrown and is used for the care of the property owner's horses. That use is not projected to change.

Citizen Response: There has been no citizen response regarding this rezoning.

- **Options:** The Planning Commission's options are the following:
 - 1. Approve the rezoning as requested and recommend approval to the Sullivan County Commission.
 - 2. Disapprove the rezoning, stating the reasons in writing, and recommend the denial to the County Commission.
 - 3. Postpone action until additional information is presented.

Staff Recommendations:

Staff recommends Option 1 for the following reasons:

- 1. The rezoning, to B-1, Neighborhood Business District, would be in keeping with established zoning patterns along the Bloomingdale corridor.
- 2. Other uses permitted under B-1 zoning are compatible with the surrounding land use.
- 3. A bed & breakfast can be a significant enhancement to the community and brings with it negligible increases in traffic or other disruptions sometimes associated with development.

County Rezoning of Joe Bledsoe Property (01-101-00014) - The Planning Commission was requested to consider a County rezoning of 4.07 acres from R-1, (Low Density) Residential District, to B-1, (Neighborhood) Business District. The property lies outside the Kingsport City limits in the 11th Civil District of Sullivan County. The proposed use is a bed and breakfast (no site plan has been submitted yet). County zoning regulations require parking and buffer plans before proposed use is adopted. Western portion of land will require current use. There is a single-family residence on the east portion of the property and grazing land for horses on the west portion of the property. Staff answered inquires from the Commission that Bloomingdale Water Division would service the site, that no City sewer would be available to the site, and that a future site plan would be submitted to the Planning Commission. Staff answered an inquiry from John Faust that the B-1 rezoning would be compatible with other businesses along Bloomingdale Pike, while restricting business use in scale to the residential neighborhood. Staff stated that the Land Use Plan, written in 1990, was outdated. Staff answered an inquiry from Mark Selby that the Sullivan County Planning Director Ambre Torbett had recommended the B-I rezoning to the applicant. Mark Selby stated that although he supported bed and breakfast businesses, he had reservations about rezoning to B-1, which could allow other uses that could impact the surrounding residential neighborhood more negatively. He opined that the Sullivan County zoning text should be more flexible in allowing in-home business occupations, making a rezoning unnecessary. Joe May stated that he felt that a commercial zoning was more appropriate along Bloomingdale Pike than residential. Staff answered an inquiry from Ken Marsh that businesses across the street from the site were automotive-related. On a motion by Ken Marsh, seconded by Joe May, the Planning Commission voted 4-1 to accept the staff's recommendation to approve the rezoning as requested and to recommend approval to the Sullivan County Commission.

MINUTES OF THE SULLIVAN COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION

The regular meeting of the Sullivan County Planning Commission was held on Tuesday, August 21, 2001 at 7:00p.m., Courthouse, Blountville, Tennessee.

The meeting was called to order at 7:11p.m. by Harry Boggs presiding as chair pro tem with a quorum present.

B. Approval of July 17, 2001 Minutes

The minutes from the July 17, 2001 meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept the minutes as presented by H. Barnes, seconded by Belcher. Motion to accept the minutes passed unanimously.

C. Rezoning Request

(1) File No. 7/01/3 Charles Newland

Reclassify A-1 property on the northwest corner of Bloomingdale Road and Timbertree Branch Road to R-1 for a new residential subdivision. Property identification No. Tax map 15, Parcel 62.00 located in the 10th Civil District.

No one was present as a representative for the rezoning. No one was present against the rezoning.

Staff Field Notes/Recommendation:

This tract of land has been recently approved as a new residential subdivision with lot sizes ranging from 2 to 3 acres each. The surrounding land uses are large estate homes, established rural residential and other agricultural/open space estates. The rezoning from A-1 to R-1 would not pose any risk of incompatible uses to the adjacent properties since all uses allowed under R-1 are also allowed under A-1. Staff recommends a favorable recommendation for this rezoning request. This rezoning application was initiated by the Sullivan County Regional Planning Commission with consent from the property owner.

(3) File No. 7/01/5 Charles Adkins

Reclassify P.B.D. (Planned Business District) property at 1557 Weaver Branch Road to A-1 to return to the original zoning. Property identification No. Tax map 110, Parcel 24.00 located in the 9th Civil District.

Mr. Adkins was present and spoke on behalf of the rezoning request. He explained that he had an agreement with a business to purchase the property and they backed out of the deal.

Staff Field Notes/Recommendation:

This property is being used as a residence with no plans for any commercial use. It is surrounded by agricultural and residential uses in the A-1 zoning classification. It is located in the Rural Area as designated on the Growth Plan map and therefore staff recommends in favor of this rezoning request.

Motion to approve the rezoning by Belcher, seconded by Hickam. The motion to approve the rezoning request passed unanimously.
D. Subdivisions

The existing home will be subdivided off as a 1.12-acre lot. Staff recommends approval of this preliminary subdivision plan with the condition that no lots are transferred or recorded prior to final plat approval.

Motion to approve the preliminary plat by H. Barnes, seconded by Belcher. The motion passed unanimously.

(3) Companion Animal Hospital, (Site Plan)

Mr. Williams was present and spoke on behalf of the site plan and his future intentions with the property.

Staff Comments and Recommendation:

The revised comprehensive development plan illustrates all requirements of the Planned Business District. The access shall be limited to Roller Drive due to the sight visibility on Highway 36. The 25-foot buffer along the development borders shall be planted with a staggered double row of conifers trees of a minimum height of 4 feet. The new sign shall require a permit and conform to the code requirements for height and setback. Any future development of the PBD area shall require approval from the Planning Commission. Staff recommends approval of this site plan as presented.

The Planning Commission approved the buffer area to be reduced to 7.5 feet along the remaining undeveloped PBD area.

Motion to approve the site plan by Belcher, seconded by Selby. The motion passed unanimously.

(4) Dannie L. Bantley, (Comprehensive Development Plan)

(1) Policy for Rights-of-Way dedication on Re-plats (de-subdivision, resubdivision, lot alteration)

Mrs. Torbett explained the text amendment to the subdivision regulations as follows:

The Sullivan County Planning Department and/or the Sullivan County Regional Planning Commission shall consider a waiver of additional Rights-of-Way road dedication, when no new lots are being created through the approval of a final plat, which has been surveyed for the purposes of altering existing lot lines. Such existing lot lines shall be determined to be part of a previously approved subdivision and/or lotsof-record. Such waiver of Subdivision Regulation requirements on rights-of-way dedication shall only be considered when no new lots are being proposed. This can be achieved through a de-subdivision of property or resubdivision of existing lot lines. If, in the opinion of the Sullivan County Highway Commissioner and/or the Sullivan County Regional Planning Commission, the waiver of additional rights-of-way would contribute or perpetuate traffic hazards along the public road, such waiver shall not be considered and all additional rights-of-way dedication shall conform to the adopted Sullivan County Major Thoroughfare Plan map. (Official Text amendment language in packets.)

Motion to recommend Mrs. Torbett to proceed with the required public hearing by Belcher, seconded by Hickam. The motion to proceed passed unanimously. 4

(2) Proposed zoning text amendment on road frontage with lots of record.

Mrs. Torbett explained the text amendment to the zoning resolution.

Motion to recommend to Mrs. Torbett to proceed with the required notification to the appropriate city staff by Belcher, seconded by Hickam. The motion to proceed passed unanimously.
