The applicant has requested rezoning to General Commercial so that they can rent out the home for either single-family, office, ٠ or retail. The planned tenant is for a pet grooming business.

- The site has commercial zoning next door, behind and across the highway.
- Directly across Fort Henry Drive (Hwy 36) is Long's Construction. Several of the other homes have been rezoned to commercial over the years.
- This site is next to Vintage Timbers, which was rezoned from R-1 to B-3 last year.
- Staff recommends in favor of this request as it would be an extension of the existing B-3 zoning district, part of the trend of redevelopment pattern and congruent with the Future Land Use Plan.

#### **Discussion at Meeting:**

- Mr. Jeff Begley, owner, was present to address the board. He stated that he has an interested tenant that would like to live at the • home and operate a pet grooming business out of the home as a form of Home Occupation.
- Staff confirmed that the B-3 zoning allows for single-family residential as well as commercial land uses, while other commercial zones do not allow both.
- Staff read her findings and recommendations. Discussion followed regarding the surrounding land uses. •
- Mrs. Mary Ann Hager motioned to send a favorable recommendation to the County Commission for the rezoning request.
- Commissioner John Gardner seconded the motion and the vote in favor passed unanimously.

SECTION 1. In accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408 (attached), the county legislative hereby creates an archives and record management fee of \$3 per record for the following records:

Courts of General Sessions, Circuit, Criminal, Probate, and Chancery, all public records filed with the clerks of court for the purpose of initiating a legal proceeding.

County Clerk of Court, public records including marriage license applications, beer permit applications, notary public applications, vehicle titles including replacement titles, and business license applications;

Planning Department, public records including building permit applications, rezoning requests, variance applications, and stormwater permits;

Highway Department, all public records to include driveway permits and road cut permits.

SECTION 2. Funds collected through this fee are designated exclusively for the county archives for scanning, storing, and maintaining any records required to be kept by law.

SECTION 3. For purposes of collection, this Resolution shall take effect on the first day of June 2018.

(SBK) [DBA Petworks] and provided for joint animal control in Sullivan County, Kingsport and Bluff City.

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2010, Sullivan County passed resolution # 2010-11-107 which authorized Sullivan County to enter into an interlocal agreement with the cities of Kingsport and Bluff City, which agreement provided for the creation of the not-for-profit corporation Sullivan County-Bluff City-Kingsport Animal Control Center, Inc. (SBK) [DBA Petworks] to provide animal control in the unincorporated areas of Sullivan County and in the corporate limits of Kingsport and Bluff City and to operate and maintain the animal control facilities in Kingsport and Blountville; and

WHEREAS, that interlocal agreement was entered into by Sullivan County, Kingsport and Bluff City on January 31, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the not-for-profit corporation Sullivan County-Bluff City-Kingsport Animal Control Center, Inc. (SBK) [DBA Petworks] was established pursuant to the filing of the charter for said corporation with the State of Tennessee on February 8, 2011, and said corporation has been in operation since that date; and

WHEREAS, it is now in the best interest of Sullivan County to dissolve said interlocal agreement such that Sullivan County will hereafter provide animal control in the unincorporated areas of Sullivan County and in the corporate limits of Bluff City and operate and maintain the animal control facility in Blountville, and Kingsport and said non-for-profit corporation will hereafter provide animal control within the corporate limits of Kingsport and operate and maintain the animal control facility in Kingsport; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Termination Agreement approved herewith Sullivan County and Bluff City irrevocably assign to Kingsport their right to appoint board members to the not-for-profit corporation, and board members previously appointed by Sullivan County and Bluff City will resign on or before January 1, 2018, which together will allow for the continued existence of the not-for-profit corporation Sullivan County-Bluff City-Kingsport Animal Control Center, Inc. subject to the sole control of the city of Kingsport and subject to whatever changes to its Charter and By-laws Kingsport hereafter deems appropriate; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby approve the attached Termination Agreement providing for the dissolution of the interlocal agreement between Sullivan County, Bluff City and Kingsport referenced above, providing for the resignation of directors appointed to Sullivan County-Bluff City-Kingsport Animal Control Center, Inc. by Sullivan County and Bluff City, and providing for the continuation of said corporation solely by the City of Kingsport; and the Board of County Commissioners hereby authorize the Mayor of Sullivan County to approve and execute said agreement and upon consultation with the County Attorney to make changes to said Termination Agreement if necessary to accomplish these goals.

## TERMINATION AGREEMENT

This Termination Agreement is entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2017, by and among SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, hereinafter referred to as Sullivan County, the CITY OF BLUFF CITY, TENNESSEE, hereinafter referred to as Bluff City, and the CITY OF KINGSPORT, TENNESSEE, hereinafter referred to as Kingsport.

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Interlocal Agreement on January 31, 2011, for the purpose of creating a not-for-profit Corporation to operate exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding section of any future tax code, by providing animal control and operation of one or more animal shelters within Sullivan County, Bluff City, and Kingsport and to prevent cruelty to animals, together with the general powers set forth under T.C.A. § 48-53-102.

WHEREAS, said not-for-profit Corporation was created, with corporate charter filed with the State of Tennessee on February 8, 2011, and currently exists and operates as Sullivan County-Bluff City-Kingsport Animal Control Center, Inc. (herein referred to as Corporation).

WHEREAS, the parties now agree that the joint operation of animal control and animal shelters as currently done pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement should be modified so that the shelter and animal control in the unincorporated area of the County and Bluff City should be operated by Sullivan County, and the shelter and animal control in Kingsport should be operated by Kingsport which can be accomplished through the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the parties remain very interested in a mutual long-term solution to animal control, which could include a single shelter for all of Sullivan County; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement sets out the general terms of the termination of the Interlocal Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Interlocal Agreement entered into by the parties on January 31, 2011, as referenced above, is hereby terminated effective midnight, December 31, 2017, subject to the provisions contained in this Agreement.

2. The parties agree that the Corporation created pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement shall continue in existence.

3. Sullivan County and Bluff City irrevocably assign to Kingsport the right to appoint board members they are entitle to appoint to the Corporation effective on the termination of the Interlocal Agreement, or earlier if so agreed by the parities, and the three board members appointed by Sullivan County will resign from the board effective on or before January 1, 2018, and the one board member appointed by Bluff City will resign from the board effective on or before January 1, 2018. This is intended

to enable Kingsport to make appointments to the Corporation's board to enable the Corporation to continue in existence and to amend its charter, bylaws and name, as needed, due to the termination of the Interlocal Agreement.

4. The Sullivan County employees currently assigned to work with the Corporation will return to Sullivan County on January 1, 2018, and the two vehicles provided by Sullivan County for their employees' use will return to Sullivan County at the same time.

5. All property donated to or given to the Corporation by Sullivan County, Bluff City, Kingsport, or any other person or entity for use for the operation of animal control and the animal shelter in Kingsport shall remain the sole property of the Corporation.

6. Beginning January 1, 2018, Sullivan County shall take over operation of the animal shelter in Blountville and animal control in the unincorporated part of the County and in Bluff City, and Kingsport and the Corporation shall be relieved from further responsibility to operate that shelter or provide animal control service in the unincorporated part of the County or in Bluff City. As of January 1, 2018, the lease agreement between Sullivan County and the Corporation, originally entered to on July 26, 2011, shall terminate and end.

7. Beginning January 1, 2018, Kingsport shall take over operation of the animal shelter and animal control in Kingsport, which may assign the continued operation of the animal shelter animal control in Kingsport to the Corporation, and Sullivan County and Bluff City shall be relieved from further responsibility to operate the shelter or provide animal control service in Kingsport.

8. Beginning on January 1, 2018, the animal control officers shall operate in their respective jurisdiction, or as otherwise provided by law, or in accordance with an Interlocal Agreement that may be entered into hereafter by the parties.

9. The parties agree that it is the intent of the parties that on the effective date of the termination that the Corporation continue to exist to operate exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding section of any future tax code, by providing animal control and operation of one or more animal shelters, and to prevent cruelty to animals, together with the general powers set forth under T.C.A. § 48-53-102, and the parties will reasonably assist the Corporation in maintaining its tax exempt status with the Internal Revenue Service, provided no parties shall be required to expend any funds in fulfilling this provision.

10. The Corporation executes this Agreement for the purpose of recognizing its benefits and duties herein, and consents and agrees to all actions taken and to be taken as described herein.

### Jobs Incentive Program (Small Business Loan Program)

The Jobs Incentive Program (JIP) was established in 2003 by the Industrial Development Board of Sullivan County. The program was created to assist local small businesses in the creation of new jobs. Only businesses that were too small (or creating too few jobs) to qualify for state grants or loans were eligible. The JIP was established as a loan program with loans based on the number of new jobs to be created. Loans to the businesses were forgiven after one year, if employment goals were met. (Loans of \$500 for each new job created were granted to businesses up to a total of \$12,500 (25 Jobs). Typical loans ranged from \$5,000 to \$7,500.)

The original funding for the program was appropriated by the County utilizing monies from land sales in the Tri-County Industrial Park and lease payments to the IDB made by Sullivan County companies which had received favorable tax incentives for locating in the county. The JIP fund started with a balance \$127,301.

Since 2003 the JIP program has assisted 17 companies and contributed to the creation of more than 1,170 new jobs in the County. This represents a cost of \$109.24 for each new job created. Some of the companies assisted include: DPI (Diversified Power International), DHL Industries, Goessling,USA, Clean & Safe, and East Tennessee Distillery. Cold Star International was aided following the loss of their building due to a fire. The JIP program also funded incentives that led to the attraction of Sprint (Agero, Inc.).

The JIP's existing fund balance is \$ 24,186. Several businesses are currently requesting loans. If approved the JIP loan funds could soon be depleted. The Industrial Development Board is requesting the County Commission continue the program with an appropriation of \$50,000. Such funds, as in the past, could be appropriated from the County's Account #58120-700 Subfund 021 (This subfund was established in 1993, with monies from the sale of County-owned Tri-County Industrial Park properties. The Subfund was created for the purpose of funding future economic development projects within the County to include local match requirements for state economic development grants and for programs like JIP.

# **RESOLUTION FOR TENNESSEE MUNICIPALITIES TO RESTORE LOCAL CONTROL**

Whereas numerous studies have found that tobacco smoke is a major contributor to indoor air pollution, and that breathing secondhand smoke is a cause of disease in healthy nonsmokers, including heart disease, stroke, respiratory disease, and lung cancer; and

Whereas the National Cancer Institute determined in 1999 that secondhand smoke is responsible for the early deaths of 53,000 Americans annually; and

Whereas the Public Health Service's National Toxicology Program has listed secondhand smoke as a known carcinogen; and

Whereas the 2006 U.S. Surgeon General's report, "The Health Consequences of Involuntary Exposure to Tobacco Smoke," concluded that there is 1) no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke; 2) ventilation and other air cleaning technologies cannot completely control for exposure of nonsmokers to secondhand smoke; 3) smoke-free workplace policies are the

only effective way to eliminate secondhand smoke exposure in the workplace, and 4) evidence from peerreviewed studies shows that smoke-free policies and laws do not have an adverse economic impact on the hospitality industry; and

Whereas the World Health Organization determined that scientific evidence has firmly established that there is no safe level of exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke, a pollutant that causes serious illness in adults and children, and that there is indisputable evidence that implementing 100% smoke-free environments is the only effective way to protect the population from the harmful effects of exposure to second-hand smoke; and

Whereas secondhand smoke is particularly hazardous to individuals with cardiovascular disease, individuals with impaired respiratory function, including asthmatics and those with obstructive airway disease, and elderly people; and

Whereas children exposed to secondhand smoke have an increased risk of asthma, respiratory infections, sudden infant death syndrome, physical and cognitive developmental abnormalities, and cancer; and

Whereas data consistently demonstrates that secondhand smoke exposure increases the risk of coronary heart disease and heart attacks *and* that smoke-free laws reduce heart attacks; and

Whereas the people in local communities should have the right to protect themselves against the harmful effects of secondhand smoke; and

Whereas local governments have the right and responsibility to adopt laws that protect the health and safety of their citizens; and

Whereas more than 4,579 local governments throughout the country have successfully passed smoke-free air laws to protect people against the harmful effects of secondhand smoke; and

Whereas the tobacco industry, in an effort to negate such local legislation, has long had as its chief legislative strategy the preemption of local authority to regulate tobacco; and

Whereas preemptive state laws have a devastating effect on tobacco control efforts and on the public health of the states' residents and workers; and

Whereas the vast majority of states do not preempt local smoke-free air legislation; and

Whereas multiple states have successfully overturned preemption and restored local control to enact and enforce smoke-free air laws; and

Whereas protecting people from the harmful effects of secondhand smoke is best accomplished by local communities working directly with the people most affected by smoke-free air laws; and

Whereas the Tennessee General Assembly should not deprive local governments of the authority to protect people from the harmful effects of secondhand smoke;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners urges the Tennessee General Assembly to repeal any preemption of local smoke-free air and other tobacco-related laws, and restore the right of local governments to enact and enforce smoke-free air and other tobacco-related laws.

And be it further resolved that the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners strongly encourages other local governmental entities in Tennessee to adopt similar resolutions.

WHEREAS, the County has updated its facilities several times over the last 30 years to no avail, and;

WHEREAS, the issue of having to continuously increase the space available for incarceration of inmates is not unique to Sullivan County, considering that most adjoining counties have recently experienced the problem or are currently experiencing the problem; and,

WHEREAS, the Jail Committee has held numerous meetings and gathered much information relevant to the problem and have decided that it is clear there are no simple solutions but the problem remains, and;

WHEREAS, considering the need to move forward at resolving the problem, the Committee has decided to seek a qualified firm to develop a Master Plan to impact and better manage the Correctional/Detention challenges before Sullivan County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, this body is directing the Purchasing Agent in consultation with the County Mayor, Sheriff and the Chairman of the Jail Committee to solicit firms with qualifications/resources for the development of a plan to provide expert direction to this body in resolving the issues before them, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Kick off Project mission statement with kick-off meeting, set up committees; refine schedules, verify data from previous assessments.
- b. Study and update inmate profile.
- c. Examine and develop recommendations for expansion of alternatives/options for pre-trial and sentenced offenders and other changes to help control the bed needs for the incarcerated.

- d. Determine bed needs by inmate category with and without proposed changes to alternatives for pre-trial and sentenced offenders and other justice system changes.
- e. Comprehensively evaluate the existing building and site and develop a facility assessment and report existing conditions.
- f. Develop master plan options for existing building renovations and expansion.
- g. Develop proposed space program. (optional)
- h. Develop conceptual floor plan with master plan phases. (optional)

BE IT RESOLVED the contract shall be limited to an initial appropriation of \$100,000 for the 2017-2018 fiscal year and shall be completed in phases as listed and reported to this body periodically as progress and time permits. Account Codes to be assigned by Director of Accounts and Budgets.
