RESOLUTION FOR TENNESSEE [GENERAL ASSEMBLY] MUNICIPALITIES TO RESTORE LOCAL CONTROL

Whereas numerous studies have found that tobacco smoke is a major contributor to indoor air pollution, and that breathing secondhand smoke is a cause of disease in healthy nonsmokers, including heart disease, stroke, respiratory disease, and lung cancer; and

Whereas the National Cancer Institute determined in 1999 that secondhand smoke is responsible for the early deaths of 53,000 Americans annually; and

Whereas the Public Health Service's National Toxicology Program has listed secondhand smoke as a known carcinogen; and

Whereas the 2006 U.S. Surgeon General's report, "The Health Consequences of Involuntary Exposure to Tobacco Smoke," concluded that there is 1) no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke; 2) ventilation and other air cleaning technologies cannot completely control for exposure of nonsmokers to secondhand smoke; 3) smoke-free workplace policies are the

only effective way to eliminate secondhand smoke exposure in the workplace, and 4) evidence from peerreviewed studies shows that smoke-free policies and laws do not have an adverse economic impact on the hospitality industry; and

Whereas the World Health Organization determined that scientific evidence has firmly established that there is no safe level of exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke, a pollutant that causes serious illness in adults and children, and that there is indisputable evidence that implementing 100% smoke-free environments is the only effective way to protect the population from the harmful effects of exposure to second-hand smoke; and

Whereas secondhand smoke is particularly hazardous to individuals with cardiovascular disease, individuals with impaired respiratory function, including asthmatics and those with obstructive airway disease, and elderly people; and

Whereas children exposed to secondhand smoke have an increased risk of asthma, respiratory infections, sudden infant death syndrome, physical and cognitive developmental abnormalities, and cancer; and

Whereas data consistently demonstrates that secondhand smoke exposure increases the risk of coronary heart disease and heart attacks and that smoke-free laws reduce heart attacks; and

Whereas the people in local communities should have the right to protect themselves against the harmful effects of secondhand smoke; and

Whereas local governments have the right and responsibility to adopt laws that protect the health and safety of their citizens: and

Whereas more than 4,579 local governments throughout the country have successfully passed smoke-free air laws to protect people against the harmful effects of secondhand smoke; and

Whereas the tobacco industry, in an effort to negate such local legislation, has long had as its chief legislative strategy the preemption of local authority to regulate tobacco; and

Whereas preemptive state laws have a devastating effect on tobacco control efforts and on the public health of the states' residents and workers; and

Whereas the vast majority of states do not preempt local smoke-free air legislation; and

Whereas multiple states have successfully overturned preemption and restored local control to enact and enforce smoke-free air laws; and

Whereas protecting people from the harmful effects of secondhand smoke is best accomplished by local communities working directly with the people most affected by smoke-free air laws; and

Whereas the Tennessee General Assembly should not deprive local governments of the authority to protect people from the harmful effects of secondhand smoke;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners urges the Tennessee General Assembly to repeal any preemption of local smoke-free air and other tobacco-related laws, and restore the right of local governments to enact and enforce smoke-free air and other tobacco-related laws.

And be it further resolved that the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners strongly encourages other local governmental entities in Tennessee to adopt similar resolutions [further requests the Sullivan County Anti-Drug Coalition periodically provide updates to this body regarding the status of this effort across the State.]

Policy Regarding Sexual Misconduct Towards a Child

Sexual abuse of a minor is a crime

SEXUAL MISCONDUCT POLICY STATEMENT

Sullivan County will not tolerate and will seek to eradicate any behavior by its employees and volunteers which constitutes Sexual Misconduct toward a child. Sexual Misconduct means any actual or attempted criminal sexual assault, sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, indecent or sexual solicitation or public indecency as defined by the state of Tennessee.

Each year, employees and volunteers of Sullivan County shall be advised of the contents of this Sexual Misconduct Policy and be instructed to report any incident of known or suspected Sexual Misconduct according to this policy.

DESIGNATED CHILD ABUSE COUNSELOR

Sullivan County Tennessee shall designate a Child Abuse Counselor who shall remain accountable for the implementation and monitoring of this policy. The identity of the Designated Child Abuse Counselor shall remain on file with Sullivan County.

REPORTING PROCEDURES

Any case of known or suspected child abuse of a minor must be reported immediately in compliance with Tennessee state law reporting requirements.

In order to conduct a timely and proper investigation, any incident of Sexual Misconduct toward a child must be reported as quickly as possible in confidence, as follows:

Victims

It is the express policy of Sullivan County Tennessee to encourage victims of Sexual Misconduct and their parents or guardians to come forward with such claims.

Employee and Volunteers

Employees and volunteers are required to report any known or suspected incidents of Sexual Misconduct toward a child according to applicable state law. They must also report to their direct supervisor, the Sullivan County Mayor or the Designated Child Abuse Counselor. If the report is made to supervisor or Mayor, that individual shall notify the Designated Child Abuse Counselor. If the person to whom an employee or volunteer is directed to report is the offending person, the report should be made to the next higher level of supervisor or any elected official of Sullivan County.

The Designated Child Abuse Counselor shall immediately notify the appropriate legal authorities as required by state or local law and the child's parent or legal guardian unless the parent or legal guardian is the alleged abuser. The Designated Child Abuse Counselor shall prepare a Suspected Child Abuse Standard Report and immediately follow-up to investigate the incident and to ascertain the condition of the child. The Designated Child Abuse

Counselor and those receiving reports of alleged sexual misconduct towards a child is encouraged to communicate any questions or concerns about any incident with legal counsel.

Investigation & Confidentiality

All formal complaints will be given a full, impartial and timely investigation. During such investigation, while every effort will be made to protect the privacy rights of all parties, confidentiality cannot be guaranteed.

Discipline

Any employee or volunteer who is determined, after an investigation, to have engaged in Sexual Misconduct toward a child in violation of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including discharge

False accusations regarding Sexual Misconduct toward a child will not be tolerated, and any person, employee or volunteer, knowingly making a false accusation will likewise be subject to disciplinary action up to and including discharge.

Any individual who retaliates against any person who reports alleged Sexual Misconduct toward a child or who retaliates against any person who testifies, assists or participates in an investigation, proceeding or hearing relating to Sexual Misconduct toward a child, will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including discharge. Retaliation includes, but is not limited to, intimidation, reprisal or harassment.

Suspension

Any employee or volunteer involved in a reported incident of Sexual Misconduct toward a child may be immediately relieved of responsibilities that involve interaction with minors or may be suspended as determined by Sullivan County. Reinstatement of employees or volunteers involved in a reported incident of Sexual Misconduct towards a child shall occur only after all allegations of such Sexual Misconduct have been cleared by the organization.

MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS

The Designated Child Abuse Counselor shall maintain all records and documentation required by law or otherwise required by this and other related policies of Sullivan County.

RESOLUTION To Appropriate Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) to Boone Lake Association to assist the Association in continuing its daily and emergency cleanup operations on Boone Lake during the lake draw down necessitated by repairs and renovations to Boone Dam.

WHEREAS, the Boone Lake Association, a non-profit organization made up of property owners on Boone Lake and supporters of Boone Lake, has for many years paid the wages of a three-man crew to work five days a week, fifty weeks out of the year, to provide daily and emergency cleanup operations on Boone Lake and its surrounding shoreline; and

WHEREAS, due to leakage in Boone Dam and related renovations and repairs to Boone Dam by the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), the water level in Boone Lake has been very low for approximately three years and will continue to be low for several years to come, potentially until 2022 and maybe longer; and

WHEREAS, during this period of low water levels in Boone Lake, TVA has given Sullivan County approximately Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars annually (\$800,000.00) to lessen the economic impact ("Impact Funds") such low water levels in Boone Lake have caused to Sullivan County with said funds to be used by Sullivan County as it sees fit; and

WHEREAS, due to a sharp reduction in dues being paid to Boone Lake Association by its members and supporters caused by the low water levels in Boone Lake, the Association is unable to financially support the three-man crew providing daily and emergency cleanup on Boone Lake; and

WHEREAS, Boone Lake Association has asked Sullivan County to appropriate \$18,000 of the 2017-2018 Impact Fund monies given to Sullivan County by TVA to assist the Association in continuing the daily clean up on Boone Lake;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby approve a one-time appropriation of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) to Boone Lake Association to assist the Association in continuing its daily and emergency cleanup operations on Boone Lake during the lake draw down.
