


WHEREAS, Joseph received the "Stephen Decatur Award" for displaying Navy core values of honor, courage, and commitment as well as several other high honors; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 8-4-401 authorizes cities and counties to use the CDBG program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sullivan County Commission hereby authorizes the Mayor of Sullivan County to make, sign, and submit an application requesting Fiscal Year 2019 Community Development Block Grant funds in the amount not to exceed \$525,000, plus any eligible Three-Star bonus allowance for the purpose of extending water distribution lines along Boozy Creek Road; and

WHEREAS, currently Sullivan County has a number of low-income residents who own pets that are not neutered or spayed which leads to a high reproduction rate among the dogs and cats across Sullivan County: and

WHEREAS, for the public good Sullivan County wishes to commit to take the lead in solving the animal overpopulation problem in Sullivan County by establishing a Spay and Neuter Fund: and

WHEREAS, the volunteer community has offered their resources to assist with solving the problem of the overpopulation of animals in Sullivan County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session this day approve rescinding Resolution No. 2018-07-42 which was approved earlier this year dealing with the same issue.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the establishment of the Sullivan County Spay & Neuter Fund to assist low income residents with spaying and neutering their animals.

Qualifications and Responsibilities

The Sullivan County Historian's job duties are an integral part of the Sullivan County Department of Archives and Tourism network. The purpose of the position is to be a resource in the community, to research and write on the county's history, and to help interpret community history by assisting teachers, schools, and civic organizations. The historian shall work closely under the auspices of the Director of Archives and Tourism to ensure that county histories are accurately presented.

The position of Sullivan County Historian is an all-voluntary position. With prior approval, a minimal amount of materials and supplies may be reimbursed by the Department of Archives and Tourism, budget permitting.

- Hold a B.S. or Master's Degree in History, or have extensive background experience in researching and documenting items of historical interest, with consistency in citing MLA, CMS or other appropriate style guide;
- · Possess good communication skills and people skills;
- Assist with county histories as needed;
- Conduct occasional historical lectures in conjunction with county archives workshops and seminars;
- Be willing to occasionally meet with media and press as needed.

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Commission has determined that fifty-two percent (52%) of the five percent (5%) commission has since been retained by the state for the purpose of funding an antiquated retirement system for county officials, and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Legislative Body has determined that the antiquated retirement system is no longer being funded by the fifty-two percent (52%) of the five percent (5%) commission entitled to be retained by the County Register's Office, and

WHEREAS, such funds are now remitted to the state treasurer and credited to the general fund of the state, and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Registers Association has asked the state legislative body to repeal the provision that reduces the commission retained by the County Register, and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Registers Association is asking the County Legislative Body to endorse and support any and all legislation repealing the provision reducing the commissions retained by the Registers of Deeds Office thereby restoring the retained commission to five percent (5%).



He attended Rock Springs Elementary and Sullivan West Middle School. He graduated from Sullivan South High School in 2002 where he was involved in the drama club and was an outstanding member of the football team.

WHEREAS CLP Light entered the military on May 15, 2003. He received Basic Combat Training at Fort Knox, Kentucky. CLP Light also completed Advanced training at Fort Knox and became a tank crewman. After completion of this training, he was assigned to Charlie Troop, 1st Squadron, 10th Cavalry Regiment, 2nd Brigade, 4th Infantry Division (Mechanized), Fort Hood Texas. CLP Light deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom 1 in 2003 with Cl-10 CAV.

WHEREAS in October 2004, CLP Light was assigned to Charlie Company, 1st Battalion, 67th Armor Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division Mechanized, Fort Hood, Texas.
