Tennessee spends \$2.67 billion annually in health care costs related to smoking and this does not include exposure to secondhand smoke. \$3.59 billion is attributed to smoking-caused productivity losses in Tennessee. (TN.gov TTP); and,

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has an adult smoking rate of 22% which is much higher than the national average and some higher than the Tennessee average. Reducing the adult smoking rate and secondhand smoke exposure with children can decrease health care costs and loss productivity due to sick days as a result of children's exposure

#### **Transfer of Funds Request**

I would like to request a transfer of funds from 53900 Administration of Justice - Juries to 53120-400 Circuit Court Clerk Supplies and Materials for \$61,000.00.

This year our court system has only had one trial since March of 2020 leaving a large surplus in the 53900 account. There is approximately \$88,000.00 left in this account and after checking with the judges we are only likely to have four to five trials for the remainder of this fiscal year if they are not reset. This gives the opportunity to complete the Criminal Court Courthouse renovation project that was started using the Covid Grant.

There are several items that are needed that we were not able to get completed due to time restraints. By transferring the money, we would be able complete the renovation and have a courtroom that will not need any modifications other than normal maintenance for years to come. This also gives the opportunity to complete the project without adding additional money to the budget.

I have been working with a vendor and he has given me GSA quotes on the large ticket items that are needed to complete the renovation. The items needed are as follows:

- Remove the 30 plus years old gallery clothe seating and replace it with hard wood benches
  that will be easy disinfect. The current gallery seating is difficult to clean, disinfect and
  deodorize and with the heavy use it gets.
- Place plexiglass in the jury box that would cover the jurors on their sides, front and back. The Supreme Court will hopefully be lifting the ban on Jury Trials in early April and it is expected that there will be stipulations on social distancing and protection for the jurors. By using the plex-glass in this manner it will hopefully allow the jurors to remove face coverings once seated. We already know that if jury trials resume and the jurors are made to wear face coverings, we will have appeals from defense attorneys. This is way to avoid bogging down the court system even more, since we are in reality two years behind on jury trials. The Supreme Court has already said they will begin to allow limited in person hearings beginning mid-March.
- Replace the juror seating with comfortable seating that will be suitable for 8-hour days
  often faced in trials.



Install cameras for the security officers for them to view the parking lot area and observe
individuals as they approach the court house via a monitor. The new lobby expansion has
somewhat limited their view and this is an inexpensive solution to improving the safety
of the courthouse.

I realize I have gone into detail with the application for which the funds will be used. I do want to stress that this is an opportunity we may not have again without having to ask for an increase. I am sure that when trials begin, we will use the majority of the money next fiscal year as the court system plays catch up.

## RESOLUTION TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS TO LYNN ROAD <del>AT OR NEAR WEST RIDGE</del> HIGH SCHOOL.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution number 2020-12-113 the Sullivan County Highway Department was authorized to develop plans to widen Lynn Road, a county road, for better access to and exit from the new West Ridge High School; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of any additional Right-of-Way and improvements to private property needs to be approved by the County Commission; and

WHEREAS, the following is an itemization of the plans to date prepared by the Sullivan County Highway Department:

- a) Widen Lynn Road near West Ridge High School to minimum of 24' (feet) using TDOT design standards.
- b) Work with property owners to secure Right of Way/Easements as needed. Currently there are11-- property owners fronting on this road, but should only need to deal with 5-6 securing any easements temporary or permanent. These easements would require moving or replacing some fences, sloping banks, reseeding property disturbed, and moving drainage ditches. Most property owners are willing to deed property to the county without any compensation in order to widen the road; however, whether property owners will demand compensation and the amount is unknown at this time. Any money compensation to be paid to private property owners must be approved by County Commission.
- c) Repave portions of county part of Lynn Road and Henry Harr.
- d) 25 MPH speed limit (standard is for 22' of pavement).
- e) Install plowable markers (reflectors) on center line on county parts of both Lynn Road and Henry Harr Road (Henry Harr at least to end of school property).
- f) At least 4" yellow and sideline re-striping (paint) and maybe 6".
- g) Install 3 speed tables on Lynn Road.
- h) Install guardrail as needed.
- i) Install signs (Curve Chevron, post reflectors, Hill Obstructs View)
- j) Maybe do rumble strips on centerline and sideline.
- k) Turn lanes not part of this proposal.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session that the Sullivan County Highway Department is



hereby authorized to make the above referred to improvements to Lynn Road and that if the appropriation of money for the acquisition of permanent Right-of-Way for such improvements shall become necessary, the Highway Department shall seek such approval and appropriation from this Commission.
