

Whereas, Barbara Schmidt became interested in flying as a young girl, she thought someday she might even want to be an Air Hostess but went on to fly around 1000 hours as a pilot. Her favorite book was "Fly Girl" by Keith O'Brien which talked about the often-missed contributions to aviation made by women. Today only 5% of pilots are women.

Whereas, her first plane ride came in 1950 while a member of the Civil Air Patrol, she would also meet her future husband Jim with whom she would have two children, the late Daniel James, and Deborah Ann. During this time both of their interests in flying grew as did their interests in Sports Flying thus joining the Experimental Aircraft Association and Charter Members of Rochester's Clover Leaf 44. It was here they began construction of their own plane.

Whereas, Barbara Schmidt has been a part of many memorable flights and adventures from building and flying her own Baby Ace, replacing the landing gear with snow skis because winter was cutting into their flying, and driving a roadable across the Canada line pass customs.


Whereas, she was once a column writer for the Ocala Star Banner, she has continued her writing in the book "Eyes on the Skies".

I desire to take a leadership role in our changing society and can help the Court address the concerns facing our community and citizens. My career has allowed me to navigate through the roles that law enforcement, criminal defendants, victims and their families, parents, struggling and displaced children, lawyers, court personnel and community resources play in our judicial system. I have seen, and been, one of the overwhelmed in the legal system. I have a deep appreciation and perspective for every individual's and agency's part in making our community how special it is. Every case, civil, juvenile and criminal, is important and needs a judge who will value that from the first filing to the final decision.

I am applying for the General Sessions Judgeship for Sullivan County, TN at Bristol. There are two full-time judges that handle the civil, criminal and juvenile matters. I bring nearly two decades of experience and practice in the exact areas assigned to this Court and have had the opportunity to appear in many courts in TN and VA to observe and learn how to manage a court's responsibilities, personnel and caseload. My Virginia license will help the Court because of my familiarity with legal, law enforcement and judicial colleagues and laws that apply, literally right across State Street in Bristol, VA. I have always been community-service oriented and I would carry my service-minded beliefs into the role as Judge and work to lead in the community as a member of the judiciary. 30. Will you uphold the law even if you disagree with the substance of the law (e.g., statute or rule) at issue? Give an example from your experience as a licensed attorney that supports your response to this question. (250 words or less)

Yes, I will not have to agree with a law or rule to enforce it.

I have seen the Order of Protection process be abused by petitioners to gain an advantage in another civil matter, despite the Court having dismissed, or the petitioner failing to appear in court, on prior filings. Orders of Protection are a necessary process to address emergency situations, but the lack of screening, or prior filing oversight, can be abused.

I have seen Courts impute minimum wage to parents for child support purposes when they have voluntarily un-or under-employed themselves solely for purposes of Court. The law on imputing income is weighed heavily against the party seeking the support of a child, who usually also has primary responsibility for caring for the child's needs. This process also plays out frequently in hearings on debtor's Motion for Slow-Pay/Installment payments, to the creditor's inability to collect.

I have seldom seen the "mitigated offender" range, or pre-trial diversion, used in sentencing first time offenders in small victimless criminal offenses that can impact their employability or educational goals.

I have been the victim/defendant of a frivolous lawsuit, Case No. 2:17-CV-103, See #22 above, and spent thousands of dollars on my own defense. Despite two different court orders requiring the lawyer and his client to make payments to my clients and I, restitution was nominal in collection attempts.
