Private Chapter \_\_\_\_\_

AN ACT to amend Chapter 349 of the Private Acts of 1947 as amended by Chapter 755 of the Private Acts of 1947, Chapters 435 and 436 of the Private Acts of 1949 and Chapter 161 of the Private Acts of 1957, relative to the Court of General Sessions of Sullivan County

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Section 1. Chapter 349 of the Private Acts of 1947, as amended, is amended so as to provide in Section 16 of said original Act as amended, that from and after September 1, 1974, the compensation of the Judges of the Sessions Court, provided for in said Act, shall be the same as eighty-five percent (85%) of the annual compensation paid to Circuit Judges and Chancellors by the State of Tennessee as provided for in Tennessee Code Annotated Section 8-2303 payable in equal monthly installments from the General Fund of Sullivan County.

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That this Act shall have no effect unless the same shall have been approved by two-thirds vote of the Quarterly County Court of Sullivan County, to which it applies, on or before the next regular meeting of such quarterly county court. occurring more than thirty days after its approval by the Chief Executive of this State. Its approval or non-approval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county court having jurisdiction to approve or the reverse, and shall be certified by him to the Secretary of State.

Section 3. Be it further enacted, that this Act take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it.
