BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Sullivan County Quarterly Court, individually and on behalf of all the citizens of Sullivan County, extends its deepest gratitude and sincere thanks to Dr. J. W. Erwin for his dedicated and unselfish service to the citizens of Sullivan County.

Dr. Erwin graduated from U. T. Medical School in Memphis, Tennessee in 1931. After that he interned at Holy Cross Hospital in Salt Lake City, Utah. He entered Public Health on February 1, 1935, and studied Public Health at Vanderbilt University in Nashville. He received a M.P.H. Degree at Johns Hopkins University in 1937. Dr. Erwin commenced servicing the citizens of Sullivan County on February 1, 1939 until his resignation of January, 1975; except for four years as a medical officer in the U. S. Army from 1942-46.

During Dr. J. W. Erwin's thirty-six years as a dedicated public health officer for the citizens of Sullivan County, he has developed many health programs for the improvement of the health of all residents. Dr. Erwin has actively participated in and established programs in Sullivan County for the elimination for some of the most dreaded diseases of mankind, such as: poliomyelitis, typhoid fever, smallpox and diphtheria.

During Dr. Erwin's administration, he developed and administered sound health programs for the eradication of tuberculosis, rubella, rubeola, infectious hepatitis and whooping cough from the County, to mention a few of the examples of achievements of Dr. Erwin as Public Health Officer for Sullivan County.

The people of Sullivan County are losing the services, not only of an extremely competent and capable health officer, but also of a fine gentleman, and a man of dedication and honor.

It is with deep regret that we accept the resignation of Dr. J. W. Erwin as Public Health Officer of Sullivan County, but we wish to extend our grateful thanks for his service to us and to mankind. We wish him the best of luck for his future endeavors.

Although we are losing a public health officer, we are fortunate that Dr. Erwin will remain with us as a citizen and resident of Sullivan County; and we are looking forward to his future accomplishments.

Educational Incentive Program

For the full time sworn officers of a police department to be eligible to receive state supplemented salary increases on the basis of college credits attained, the employing department must be in compliance with the minimum employment and training standards in TCA 38-1104 and 1105, and must have filed with the Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Agency an educational incentive plan approved by the Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Commission.

Local Agencies: the governing body of the jurisdiction served by a local police agency must resolve to provide salary incentive payments to full time sworn officers on the basis of college credits attained, with the understanding that 50 percent of such salary increases will be paid by the Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Commission so long as the payment schedule is consistent with Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Commission guidelines. (see below)

Eligibility

The local unit of government must file with the Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Agency an educational incentive plan consistent with the following Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Commission guidelines:

1. College credit will be accepted only for courses which are necessary for a degree in a program approved by the

local police agency. All college credits or degrees attained prior to the effective date of the act are eligible for salary incentive.

Officers should be encouraged to pursue degrees in criminal justice.

2. Salary increases for educational attainment will begin only after the officer's completion of one of the following increments:
 - a. 25 semester hours (37.5 quarter hours)
 - b. 55 semester hours (82.5 quarter hours or an associate degree)
 - c. 85 semester hours (127.5 quarter hours)
 - d. Bachelor's Degree
3. Salary increases will be in accordance with the following levels of achievement:
 - a. 25 semester hours-annual increase of \$200.00 State pays \$100.00
 - b. 55 semester hours-annual increase of \$450.00 State pays \$225.00
 - c. 85 semester hours-annual increase of \$700.00 State pays \$350.00
 - d. Bachelor's degree-annual increase of \$1,000.00 " " \$500.00

The total cost of this program to Sullivan County this year is \$4,150.00.

In-Service Salary Supplement Program

To be eligible for salary supplement(s) cited in Chapter 810, Public Acts, 1974, a department must require all full time sworn officers employed to satisfactorily complete an approved in-service training course each calendar year. Such agencies must also be in compliance with the minimum employment and training standards cited in TCA 38-1104 and 1105.

The governing body of the jurisdiction served by a police agency (e.g., city council, county quarterly court) must resolve to require that all full time sworn personnel satisfactorily complete an approved in-service training course each calendar year. Evidence of such resolution must be transmitted to the Tennessee Law Enforcement Planning Agency on the following form.

This program provides that each officer that completes a minimum of forty hours in-service training per year will receive a supplement from the State of Tennessee according to the following schedule.

January	1975	5%
January	1976	7½%
January	1977	10%
January	1978	12½%
January	1979	15%

These percentages are computed with the officers gross base salary. This program is available to the County at no cost.

P R O P O S A L

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

TO THE COUNTY OF SULLIVAN, TENNESSEE:

The DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION of the State of Tennessee, hereinafter called "DEPARTMENT", proposes to construct a project designated as NOS: 82085-2209-09 and 82086-2204-04 - (SR 126, Bridge Widening at LM 10.96, 13.60 and 16.44; Robinson Creek, Evans Creek and Seneker Creek) - in the COUNTY OF SULLIVAN, provided the COUNTY will cooperate with the DEPARTMENT as set forth in this proposal so that the general highway program be carried out in accordance with the intent of the General Assembly of the State.

Accordingly, if the COUNTY will agree:

1. That in the event any actions in cross- eminent domain or for damages are instituted by reason of the DEPARTMENT, or its contractor, going upon the right-of-way and easements, and constructing said project in accordance with the plans and as necessary to make the completed project functional, it will notify in writing, the DEPARTMENT'S Attorney, whose address is Department of Transportation, 408 Frost Building, Nashville, Tennessee 37219, of the institution of each civil action, the complaint and all subsequent pleadings, within ten (10) days after the service of each of the same, under penalty of defending such civil actions and paying any judgments which result therefrom at its own expense; and

2. To transfer or cause to be transferred to the DEPARTMENT without cost to it, all land owned by the COUNTY or by any of its instrumentalities as required for right-of-way or easement purposes, provided such land is being used or dedicated for road or other public way purposes; and

3. Not to pass any Resolutions which would be in conflict with any of the above prescribed provisions; then

Following the acceptance of this proposal, the DEPARTMENT will acquire the rights-of-way and easements as necessary to construct the project in accordance with the plans and any amendments thereto; thereafter accomplish the construction, and defend any cross-eminent domain or damage civil actions of which it has received the notices provided for herein.

The project plans hereinbefore identified by number and description are incorporated by reference thereto and shall be considered a part of this proposal, including any revisions or amendments thereto, provided a copy of each is furnished the COUNTY.

The acceptance of this proposal shall be evidenced by the passage of a proper Resolution which shall incorporate the same verbatim, or by reference thereto, at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the County Court.


