Ladies and Gentlemen:

Sullivan County Schools closed Saturday, June 2. Average daily attendance for the school year was 17,718.

Sullivan County Schools will reconvene with students attending classes on Monday, August 27. Teachers and other school personnel will be in workshops the week prior to August 27. Teachers, caretakers, and lunchroom personnel have been employed for next year.

We are operating a summer school for high school and elementary school students with approximately two hundred in high school at Central High and seven hundred in an elementary program in six elementary centers -- Blountville, Bluff City, Cedar Grove, Lynn Garden, Sullivan and Valley Pike. Our elementary summer program is operated with federal revenue. Also during the summer we have approximately seventy teachers and caretakers painting the following schools: Bell Ridge, Colonial Heights, Emmett, Holston Point, Rock Springs, Sullivan Elementary, Sunrise, and Weavers. For several years we have had a rotating schedule with all schools being painted every five or six years.

Revenue Sharing funds in the amount of \$995,874.24 are presently being used to make capital improvements in our schools. These improvements are for new roofs, improvement in heating systems and other necessary capital expenditures.

We have opened bids on approximately \$399,323.67 of these funds at this time.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to Judge Boyd and all members of the Court for the splendid support which has been given to me and the Board of Education during the past year.

## CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

We, the undersigned, desiring to form a corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of the laws of the State of Tennessee, and particularly under the provisions of Chapter 19 of Title 48, Tennessee Code Annotated, do hereby certify as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

Our names and residences are given hereinafter following our signatures; each of us is an elector and taxpayer in Sullivan County, Tennessee.

## ARTICLE II

The name of this corporation shall be The Health and Educational Facilities Board of the County of Sullivan, Tennessee.

## ARTICLE III

Permission to organize this corporation has been granted by a resolution duly adopted by the Quarterly County Court of Sullivan County, Tennessee, on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 1973.

### ARTICLE IV

The location of the principal office of this corporation shall be <u>County Lounthouse</u>, Blountville, Tennessee, and the mailing address shall be <u>General Belivery</u> Blountville, Tennessee.

#### ARTICLE V

The purposes for which this corporation is organized are to acquire, own, lease and dispose of properties to the end that such corporation may be able to promote the health and higher education

of the people of the State and Sullivan County, Tennessee, and surrounding areas, and to exercise the authority of, and pursue the objectives of, health and educational facilities corporations as provided for in Chapter 19, Title 48, Tennessee Code Annotated, it being the intention of the incorporators to make the scope of the authorized activities of this corporation and the corporate power of this corporation as broad as is permitted by the applicable statutes of the State of Tennessee.

#### ARTICLE VI

This corporation shall have 7 directors, all of whom shall be duly qualified electors and taxpayers in Sullivan County, Tennessee, whose terms of office, qualifications and duties shall be as provided for in Chapter 19, Title 48, Tennessee Code Annotated.

#### ARTICLE VII

The term of existence of this corporation shall be perpetual.

#### ARTICLE VIII

This corporation shall have all the general powers authorized by said Chapter 19, Title 48, Tennessee Code Annotated, including amendments thereto hereafter adopted, and all powers incidental thereto or necessary for the performance thereof, including but not limited to the following: (1) to have succession by its corporate name in perpetuity unless sooner dissolved; (2) to sue and be sued and to prosecute and defend, at law or in equity, in any court having jurisdiction of the subject matter and the parties; (3) to have and to use a corporate seal and to alter the same at pleasure; (4) to acquire, whether by purchase, construction, exchange, gift, lease, or otherwise, and to improve, maintain, extend, equip and furnish one (1) or more projects, which

projects may be either within or without the corporate limits of Sullivan County, including all real and personal properties which the board of directors of this corporation may deem necessary in connection therewith and regardless of whether or not any such projects shall then be in existence; (5) to lease to a hospital institution or an institution of higher education any or all of its projects upon such terms and conditions as the board of directors shall deem proper and to charge and collect rent therefor and to terminate any such lease upon the failure of the lessee to comply with any of the obligations thereof; and to include in any such lease, if desired, provisions that the lessee thereof shall have options to renew the term of the lease for such period or periods and at such rent as shall be determined by the board of directors of the corporation and/or to purchase any or all of its projects or that upon payment of all of the indebtedness of the corporation it may lease or convey any or all of its projects to the lessees thereof with or without consideration; (6) to sell, exchange, donate, and convey any or all of its properties whenever the board of directors shall find any such action to be in furtherance of the purposes for which the corporation was organized; (7) to borrow money and issue its bonds for the purpose of carrying out any of its powers; (8) as security for the payment of the principal of and interest on any bonds so issued and any agreements made in connection therewith, to mortgage and pledge any or all of its projects or any part or parts thereof, whether then owned or thereafter acquired, and to pledge the revenues and receipts therefrom or from any thereof; (9) to employ and pay compensation to such employees and agents, including attorneys, as the board of directors shall deem necessary for the business of this corporation; and (10) to exercise all powers expressly given in this certificate of incorporation and to establish by-laws and make all

WHEREAS, the General Assembly for the State of Tennessee amended SECTION 3. Section 59-410, subsection (a), Tennessee Code Annotated, by substituting for the second and third sentences the following: "THE REGISTRATION PLATE ISSUED FOR A TRUCK OR TRUCK TRACTOR SHALL BE ATTACHED TO THE FRONT OF THE VEHICLE."; and

WHEREAS, approximately 10,000 truck tags are issued for trucks in Sullivan County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, this amendment has created general confusion in the enforcement of the registration laws of this State and in adjoining states, causing our citizens to receive citations for Court appearances for not having a license tag attached to the rear of their vehicle when traveling in other states, and has caused general inconvenience of the residents of this State in removing the truck tag from the rear to the front of said vehicle, and

WHEREAS, the law enforcement officers have been unable to read the numbers on the license tag or identify trucks from the rear by the license tag; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee is the only State at the present time, to the knowledge of the writer of this Resolution, which requires the license tag of a truck to be placed in the front of the vehicle without any identification upon the rear; and

WHEREAS, this amendment requiring the truck tag to be attached to the front of the vehicle is contrary to the best interests of the citizens of the State of Tennessee;

BE IT, THERFORE, RESOLVED that this Court by this
Resolution does urge the legislators representing this County
to initiate and cause to be passed in the General Assembly for
the State of Tennessee at its next session, legislation which

would permit the license upon trucks to be attached to the rear of the vehicle and which will require the license plate of such trucks to be attached to the rear of the vehicle as of the issuance of new registration license plates in 1974.


