BE IT RESOLVED THAT

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has nine (9) Volunteer Fire Departments protecting the rural areas of the County and,

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Quarterly Court has a direct interest in and provides financial support to these departments and,

WHEREAS, the Insurance Underwriters do not recognize the existence of eight (8) of these nine (9) departments which results in a higher insurance premium rate than if the departments were recognized and,

WHEREAS, one reason why the departments are not recognized is the lack of a County-Wide Volunteer Fire Association.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, THEREFORE, that a Sullivan County Volunteer Fire Department Association is hereby established. The membership of the Association shall consist of the members of each volunteer fire department chartered to protect areas outside the three incorporated cities in the County. The Fire Departments in Bristol, Bluff City and Kingsport will be invited to join and participate in the activities of the Association.

The objectives of the Association are:

- a. To improve the fire fighting effectiveness of individual members through training and thus improve the efficiency of each department.
- b. To coordinate the activities of the various departments when such activities tend to overlap jurisdictional areas, For example, fund-raising, communications and training,
- c. Provide a central point of contact with the County Governmental structure to request and/or provide assistance in the event of disaster operations.

- d. To establish zones of firefighting responsibility and change such zones as necessary to meet changing conditions.
- e. To provide a means of disseminating new and advanced technical information pertaining to the latest methods of fighting fire and saving of human lives.
- f. To make recommendations to the Sullivan County Quarterly Court regarding funding assistance and any other matters requiring action by the Court.
- g. To provide a forum for discussion and solution of common problems.

To attain the aforesated objectives the following procedures are established:

1. The association will meet once each calendar quarter at a time and place to be determined.

2. The Association will, on its initial meeting, elect the following officers:

- President
- Vice-President
- Secretary

The term of office will be as determined by the Association.

The Secretary of the Association will be the point of contact with the Safety Committee of the Quarterly Court and will keep the Safety Committee advised of the activities of the association.

3. The association will also establish at least three committees to wit:

- Training Committee
- Communications Committee
- Financial Committee

Membership of each committee will consist of one member from each of the nine (9) Volunteer Fire Departments.

The membership of each committee will elect a chairman and a vice-chairman ^{or Secretary} and make recommendations to the association on all matters referred to it for action.

 six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per annum, for administrative

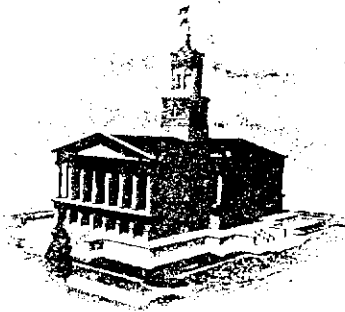

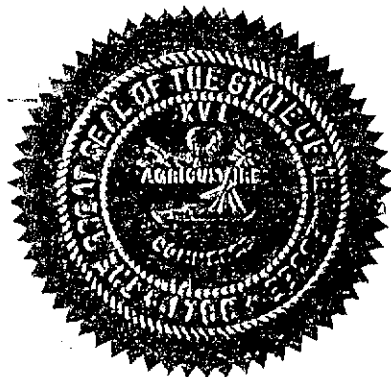

AN ACT to amend Chapter 609 of the Private Acts of 1935, which created the office of county attorney in Sullivan County, as amended by Chapter 27 of the Private Acts of 1935 (First Ex. Sess.), Chapter 524 of the Private Acts of 1937, Chapter 299 of the Private Acts of 1943, Chapter 231 of the Private Acts of 1959, Chapter 360 of the Private Acts of 1961, and Chapter 288 of the Private Acts of 1974, relative to the compensation of the county attorney.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 609 of the Private Acts of 1935, as amended by Chapter 27 of the Private Acts of 1935 (First Ex. Sess.), Chapter 524 of the Private Acts of 1937, Chapter 299 of the Private Acts of 1943, Chapter 231 of the Private Acts of 1959, Chapter 360 of the Private Acts of 1961, and Chapter 288 of the Private Acts of 1974, is further amended by deleting Section 3 thereof entirely, and by substituting instead the following:

Effective September 1, 1976, the county attorney shall receive as compensation for his services the maximum annual salary of Seventeen Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$17,997.00), which salary shall be adjusted each year on September 1, according to the provisions for adjustment of compensation in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-2303.

SECTION 2. This Act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Quarterly County Court of Sullivan County before August 1, 1977. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the Quarterly County Court of Sullivan County and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 2.

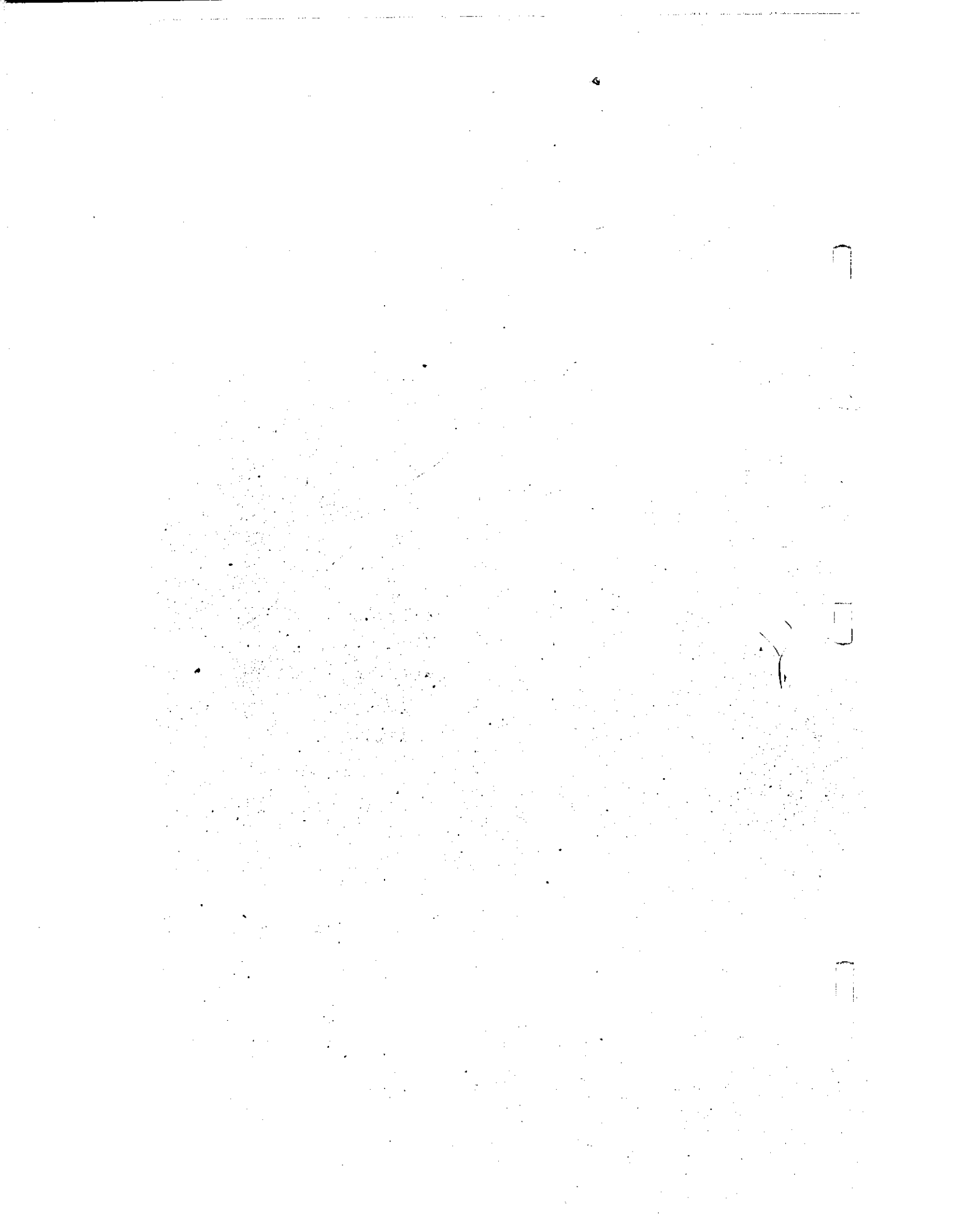


