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1. RESOLUTION IN RE:

THREE MILLION DOLLARS (\$3,000, 0
GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED THAT WHEREAS it is necessary and advisable that Sullivan County, Tennessee, issue general improvement bonds, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed funds for the purpose of the following: (a) Financing part of the costs of making certain road and sewer improvements (Miller Park); (b) Financing part of the cost on purchasing and making certain road, sewer, and site improvements for an Industrial Park (Bristol Industrial Park); (c) Providing for capitalized interest and defraying the costs of issuance.

WHEREAS said County is authorized by Sections 5-11-101 through 5-11-124, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, to issue bonds for such purpose;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There shall be issued the negotiable bonds (the "Bonds") of Sullivan County, Tennessee, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed three million (\$3,000,000) Dollars for the purpose of the following: (a) 1.1 million dollars for financing part of the costs of making certain sewer improvements (Miller Park); (b) \$400,000 for financing part of the costs of making certain road improvements (Miller Park); (c) 1.25 million dollars for financing Industrial Park (Bristol Industrial Park); (d) \$250,000 for capitalized interest for a period of six months; all of the foregoing to include all property, real and personal, appurtenant thereto or connected therewith, and defraying all necessary and incidental expenses in connection therewith and in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 2. The Bonds shall be issued pursuant to Sections 5-11-101 to 5-11-124, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended; shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding (10%) per annum; and shall be payable, both principal and interest, from taxes to be levied, without limitation as to time, rate or amount, on all taxable property in Sullivan County, Tennessee.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption, the welfare of Sullivan County, Tennessee, requiring it.

BRISTOL 201 FACILITY

BE IT RESOLVED THAT. the Sullivan County Commission hereby approves the purchase of wastewater capacity for the county residents in the Bristol 201 area; and

NOW THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED THAT. the Sullivan County Commission appropriates \$1,533,850.00 for the county's share for the Bristol Wastewater Treatment Plant to buy space for the 201 area for 2,754 million gallons per day capacity. This capacity will be purchased on the following terms.

1. The cost of treating all wastewater will be the same for the residents of the City and Sullivan County.

2. The capacity that is purchased by Sullivan County in the wastewater plant will be reserved for use of county residents only. In the event the City of Bristol annexes any part of Sullivan County which is using the sewer capacity as purchased by Sullivan County, then Bristol will purchase the annexed capacity at current replacement value. This is contingent upon Sullivan County purchasing 1.5 million dollars worth of capacity.

3. Any other wastewater treatment charges outside of treatment costs will be determined by Sullivan County, the appropriate utility district, or some other entity which has constructed and installed a wastewater treatment line.

AMENDMENT TO EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK

BE IT RESOLVED THAT. the Sullivan County Commissioners approves the following amendments to the Sullivan County Employee Handbook: This handbook has been designed for general information only. It is not an exclusive statement of all the terms of employment. It is also not a guarantee to any employee of the matters covered in any particular topic.

The topics covered herein are subject to change without advance notice, and the employer reserves the right to make final decisions as to interpretation of each policy and practice covered herein.

1. PERSONAL LEAVE, page 7 - Add - If an employee leaves the County's employ before September 1, that employee's personal days will be prorated.

2 SICK LEAVE - page 5 - Delete - Workmen's Compensation benefits and sick leave cannot be drawn simultaneously. Add - An employee receiving Workers' Compensation benefits will be allowed to take sufficient sick leave to approximate normal pay.

3. ABUSE OF SICK LEAVE - page 6 - Delete- Which are not medically or supervisorly verified as provided herein. Add - No occasion will be charged when sick leave is used for death in the immediate family. Add - Only one occasion will be charged for an illness which requires continual or multiple treatments. i.e. cancer.

4 DISCIPLINARY ACTION. Page 9 - Add - Employment by Sullivan County, Tennessee. is for an indefinite period of time. The County reserves the right to change wages, classification, benefits, and conditions at any time. We could never list all acts, omissions, and attitudes that a good employee is expected to avoid. There are too many variations, special applications, and situations. This list should, therefore, not in any way be considered a restriction on the right of the County to establish future policy or apply disciplinary measures, including termination, to cases other than those listed.

5 The Department Head will have ultimate decision on all actions in the department.
