Staff Field Notes and Findings of Facts:

 The developers are requesting a rezoning of the existing single-family dwelling from PBD/SC to R-1 (see minor plat for boundary) and the remaining acreage planned for R-3A zoning to allow for an 18-unit Townhouse Condominium Development.

- The developer of the adjoining Condominium Development, Stratford Glen, was also built by Terry Orth Construction.
- The developer's engineer and surveyor have submitted a Concept Plan to meet the Zoning Requirements for such
 use.
- The Zoning District Map has this parcel spot zoned to PBD/SC in the original zoning plan.
- The Land Use Plan has this designated Low Density Residential; however, due to the construction of the
 condominium development directly adjacent (NE) the proposed land use would be a continuation of the existing land
 use. The adjacent condominium development is within the City of Bluff City.
- This area is served by Johnson City Public Utilities and the city has agreed to serve the townhouses for public water and public sewer. Garbage pick-up will have to be contracted out to private disposal service as all county properties have.
- Staff recommends in favor of this rezoning request:
 - the proposed rezoning would conform with existing surrounding land uses;
 - existing commercial zone would allow for incompatible land uses in this residential area;
 - public utilities are approved to support the planned residential development.




Land Use Plan

Existing Zoning Plan



The Need for Branch House

Sexual and Domestic Violence in Sullivan County

- Highest Sexual Assault Rate: The Tennessee Department of Health reported that Sullivan County had the highest rate of sexual assault in the state in both 2020 and 2021, and ranked 2nd highest from 2016 to 2019.
- Highest Domestic Violence Rate in Northeast Tennessee: According to TBI Crime Insights, Sullivan County recorded 1,246 domestic violence reports in 2023—nearly double the number in neighboring Washington County.

Impact & Benefit to Citizens

- Prior to BH- 71% of homicides in Sullivan County were DV related
- In the past 5 years 27% of homocides were DV related
- 2004 Report from TN Comproller of the Treasury- each homicide in TN costs taxpayers an average of \$401,138

Branch House Funding

Due to cuts in Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding, Branch House no longer receives federal funding. In January 2025, Branch House was transitioned from the Office of Criminal Justice Programs (OCJP) to a temporary state funding source through June 30, 2025. However, the funding source for FY 2025-2026 remains uncertain.

The \$50,000 funding request will be used to:

- Continue to provide free coordinated services & resourcers to victims of violence
- Sustain Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program operations
- Fund ongoing training and education for SART & DVRT members
- Enhance service provision and accessibility for clients
- Provide free office space for partner agencies

Organizational Summary

Through collaboration with over 40 local and national organizations and on-site partners (Frontier Health, Abuse Alternatives, and Legal Aid of East TN), Branch House coordinates a wide range of critical, no-cost services, including:

- Sexual assault forensic examinations
- Emergency financial assistance for families fleeing abuse
 - New resource added this year after securing grant funding from SCC
- Protective orders and civil legal assistance
- Immediate and long-term advocacy
- Counseling
- Emergency shelter and housing assistance
- Pet fostering for survivors unable to leave pets behind
- · Emergency food provisions
- Transportation coordination
- Emergency cell phones
- Ring doorbells for enhanced safety
 - o New resource added this year



Beyond direct victim services, Branch House is a leader in interagency coordination, working to improve systemic responses to interpersonal violence:

- Sexual Assault Response Team (SART): A monthly collaboration among law enforcement, Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANEs), advocates, prosecutors, and mental health professionals to ensure sexual assault cases are handled effectively, legally, and with survivor-centered care.
- Coordinated Community Response (CCR): A quarterly forum for partner organizations to strengthen agency collaboration, identify service gaps, and enhance service provision.
- Domestic Violence Response Team (DVRT): In 2024, Branch House launched the region's first and only DVRT, using Branch House developed and law enforcement-led lethality assessments to identify high-risk domestic violence cases in need of intervention to reduce the risk of domestic violence-related homicides.

Through these agency meetings changes to domestic violence & sexual assault laws are discussed and included in agency policies and protocols to ensure compliance. Cases are also reviewed to ensure victims/cases aren't ignored or improperly investigated.

Branch House was designated as command central where all victims were brought. Agency interviews were conducted on-site, and Branch House coordinated/provided:

Projects Funded

In July 2023, Branch House became the primary provider of sexual assault forensic exams in Sullivan County following an agreement with Ballad Health. **Branch House is the only**:

- Community-based SANE program within a 100-mile radius
- Non-grant-funded SANE program in Tennessee
- Hybrid family justice center and sexual assault center in the state
 - Other regions have both which require separate funding- Separate directors & staff, separate building costs
- FJC in the state with a SART (Sexual Assault Response Team) Coordinator
 - Referred by TN Coalition to meet with Capital Hill Gov Relations group to discuss the importance & role of SART Coordinators
 - Two bills being voted on by TN senate to mandate the SART Coordinator position statewideintroduced by Senator Bobby Harshbarger

Process for creating and building the program detailed in an article published in the Journal of Forensic Nursing.



This unique model has earned statewide recognition, with Branch House considered a bench mark program. We are frequently consulted by state agencies and officials on issues surrounding sexual assault response and forensic service provision. In 2024, the SANE program was honored at the Tennessee Family Justice Center Conference for its contributions. New directors are sent to BH for training.

Sustaining and Expanding SANE Services

State law mandates that medical forensic services must be provided at no cost to victims, yet state reimbursements fail to cover the full costs of:

- Clinical equipment and medical supplies
- SANE nurse compensation
- Annual medical liability insurance premiums
- International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN) memberships and certifications
- Specialized SANE training courses

BH will always work to expand & improve services. We're already working to:

- Become an IAFN approved clinical preceptor site
- Develop a 40 hour SANE instructional course to provide in-person education
 - o This would save BH money but could also be a source of income
- *We're always working toward becoming more financially independent & self-sustaining, while still providing free services & resources to those in need, but that's a process that takes time.





WHEREAS historically, the Sullivan County Commission has included funding for nonprofit organizations in the county's annual fiscal year budget; and

WHEREAS the total amount of dollars spent to assist nonprofit organizations, as well as the number of organizations seeking and receiving county funding has grown; and

WHEREAS development of the 2025-2026 FY Budget is in its early stages and there is discussion of zeroing out all county funding to nonprofit organizations; and

WHEREAS instead, a change in process would better benefit the county, the nonprofits in question and county residents, and promote (rather than destroy) the goodwill brought upon Sullivan County for continued partnership with those working in community service to help others; and

WHEREAS county funding not only directly helps nonprofit organizations, but also helps, perhaps more so, indirectly, as "seed money" by providing proof to other potential donors that the organizations have the support and confidence of Sullivan County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Sullivan County Commission approves appropriation of up to and no more than \$200,000 within the General Fund each fiscal year, beginning with FY 2025-2026 and in perpetuity, for potential allocation to nonprofit organizations.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED allocations from the new account will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the Sullivan County Commission, and consideration of requests for funding will take place only after the completion and approval of each fiscal budget year, and/or after July 1 of the calendar year in which the fiscal year begins, whichever last occurs.
