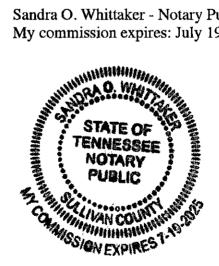

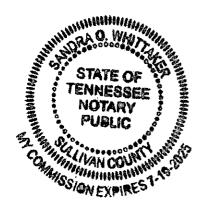

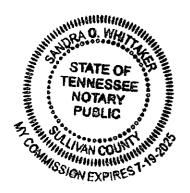

A RESOLUTION FOR SULLIVAN COUNTY TO ENTER A PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CITY OF BRISTOL TENNESSEE FOR PURCHASE AND SUBSEQUENT CO-OWNERSHIP OF 260 MIDWAY MEDICAL PARK, BRISTOL, TENNESSEE, TO EXPAND SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE SULLIVAN COUNTY REGIONAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT AT A NEW LOCATION TO BE AT THAT ADDRESS.

WHEREAS to best serve county residents who live in the greater Bristol, Tennessee area, the Sullivan County Regional Health Department has an opportunity to provide public health services, now available only in Blountville and Kingsport locations of the department, to a location within the city of Bristol, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS this opportunity is available through a partnership with the city of Bristol, Tennessee, which has a limited-time option to purchase an 8,772 square foot, two-story medical clinic facility located at 260 Midway Medical Park, Bristol, Tennessee, for the sum of \$640,000 \$589,000; and

WHEREAS the city of Bristol, Tennessee, currently leases space in the building and plans to continue to use that space – approximately 30% of the total square footage - for its own purposes after purchasing the property; and

WHEREAS the estimated value of the space used by the city is \$189,000; and

WHEREAS the city is willing and able to fund the full purchase, if the county commits to repay the city for the remaining cost of the property, in equal payments over four fiscal years; and

WHEREAS a third-party inspector is scheduled to visit the property on Monday, May 12, and provide a report on major components (roof, HVAC, etc.) to the health department no later than close of business Tuesday, May 13; and

WHEREAS a called meeting of the Sullivan County Building Committee and the committee's recommendation in favor of this resolution is required for this resolution to come for a vote by the full Sullivan County Commission on May 15.

SECTION 1: The City of Bristol, TN will pay the entire purchase price of \$589,000 upon closing and will receive title to the building at that time.

SECTION 2: The City of Bristol, TN will be responsible for \$189,000 of the total purchase price to pay for their portion of the building on the upper level of the Midway Medical Park building (approximately 30% of the building's total square footage).

SECTION 3: Sullivan County will be responsible for \$400,000 of the total purchase price to pay for their portion of the building (approximately 70% of the building's total square footage).

SECTION 4: Sullivan County will enter into a Lease Purchase Agreement with the City of Bristol, TN to lease 6,141 square feet of the building, which includes 100% of the lower floor in the building (4,386 sq ft) and approximately 40% of the upper floor (1,754 sq ft). Sullivan County will use this facility to open and operate a Health Department building, which will serve the citizens of Bristol, TN.

SECTION 5: The remaining 60% of the upper floor of the building (2,631 sq ft) will continue to be occupied by the City of Bristol, TN to provide employee services to their City employees.

SECTION 6: Sullivan County will reimburse the City of Bristol, TN \$400,000 to pay for their portion of the Midway Medical Park building. This reimbursement will be paid to the City of Bristol, TN in four equal installments of \$100,000 over four consecutive years, beginning on January 1st, 2026 and ending (with a final payment of \$100,000) on January 1st, 2029.

SECTION 7: Sullivan County will be responsible for paying 70% of the closing costs associated with purchasing the Midway Medical Park building. This payment will be made in a lump sum payment on January 1st, 2026.

SECTION 8: Once Sullivan County has reimbursed the City of Bristol, TN the full amount of \$400,000, a condominium plat will be prepared by the appropriate attorneys and new titles to the property will be provided to each of the respective owners (one to Sullivan County and one to the City of Bristol, TN).

SECTION 9: The attorney for the City of Bristol, TN will work with the Sullivan County attorney to work out the legal details associated with the Lease / Purchase Agreement.

SECTION 10: The attorney for the City of Bristol, TN will work with the Sullivan County attorney to document a Maintenance Agreement, which will cover both minor maintenance issues, as well as major maintenance repairs. This Maintenance Agreement will include:

- The City of Bristol, TN will be responsible for maintaining 100% of the outside grounds, including mowing, landscaping, and keeping parking areas and sidewalks cleared of snow and ice.
- Any maintenance repairs that affect the building as a WHOLE (such as a new roof or gutters, for example) will be split (70% to be paid by Sullivan County and 30% to be paid by the City of Bristol, TN).
- Any maintenance repairs that SOLELY affect the portion of the building owned by Sullivan County or which SOLELY affect the portion of the building owned by the City of Bristol, TN, will be paid entirely (100%) by the respective entity.

#### Resolution: MINERAL SEVERANCE TAX INCREASE.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, §§ 67-7-201 et seq., permits counties, upon the adoption of a resolution by a two-thirds vote of the county legislative body, to enact a mineral severance tax for the benefit of the county road fund to be administered by the state Department of Revenue; and,

WHEREAS, Sullivan County levied a mineral severance tax on sand, gravel, sandstone, chert and limestone severed from the ground within its jurisdiction pursuant to the authority granted in Tennessee Code Annotated, §§ 67-7-201 et seq., in Resolution Number 2022-03-35;

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, §§ 67-7-201 et seq., permits counties to increase the mineral severance tax in accordance with the rates set forth in § 67-7-203;

WHEREAS, due to factors such as rising material costs, inflation, and supply chain disruptions, the cost of county road and bridge construction and maintenance has increased dramatically and Sullivan County needs additional revenue for construction and maintenance of its roads and bridges;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the county legislative body of Sullivan County that: SECTION 1. There is hereby levied an increase in mineral severance tax on the above-named minerals at a total levy of twenty cents (\$0.20) per ton for a tax period beginning July 1, 2025.

SECTION 2. The Mineral Severance Tax of Sullivan County, shall be collected by the state Department of Revenue in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Revenue.

SECTION 3. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted immediately upon its passage to the Department of Revenue of the State of Tennessee by the County Clerk and shall be spread upon the minutes of the county legislative body.

SECTION 4. For purposes of collection, this Resolution shall take effect on the first day of the month occurring at least sixty (60) days after the certified copy is received by the Department of Revenue; for all other purposes it shall be effective upon passage by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the county legislative body of Sullivan County, the public welfare requiring it.

SECTION 1: The Project to be performed, and referred to herein as the "Project," is described as follows:

Local Route (0A868), River Bend Road/Piney Hill Road/Beidleman Road from SR-44, LM 0.00 to SR-34, LM 2.90;
Local Route (0A942/0A857), Flatwoods Road from USFS Boundary, LM 7.35 to Morrell Creek Road, LM 8.52 and from Morrell Creek Road, LM 1.28 to SR-44, LM 2.39;
Local Route (0B080), Rock Lane from Mountain View Drive, LM 0.00 to SR-34, LM 1.20"

SECTION 2: Tenn. Code Ann. § 54-1-126 provides that the Department shall enter into a written contract that provides that the Agency is solely responsible for all maintenance of the completed work of the Project. Therefore, the provisions set forth in Tenn. Code Ann. § 54-1-126 shall apply to this Agreement. The Agency shall be solely responsible for and pay all costs associated with maintenance of the Project. The Agency acknowledges that where any local road under the jurisdiction of the Agency ("Local Road") intersects with a state highway or other public road, the Agency's maintenance responsibility for the Local Road; including but not limited to traffic control devices, continues across the right-of-way of the intersecting state highway or public road.

The Agency's maintenance responsibility described herein includes, but is not limited to, lighting, signals and other electrically operated and/or solar powered devices which may be installed as part of the Project. The Agency shall be solely responsible for and pay all costs associated with maintenance and operation of all electrically operated devices which may be installed as part of the Project, together with the related equipment wiring and other necessary appurtenances, and the Agency shall furnish electrical current to all such devices. Additionally, the Agency shall be solely responsible for and pay all costs associated with the maintenance and operation of solar powered devices which may be installed as part of the Project including but not limited to replacement of solar panels, batteries, lights and lenses.

SECTION 3: The Agency shall assume all liability for third party claims and damages arising from the maintenance, existence and use of the Project to the extent provided by Tennessee law and subject to the provisions, terms and liability limits of the Governmental Tort Liability Act, Tenn. Code Ann. § 29-20-101, et seq. and all applicable laws.

SECTION 4: The Agency agrees to comply with all applicable federal and Tennessee laws and regulations in the performance of its duties under this Agreement. The parties hereby agree that failure of the Agency to comply with this provision shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement and subject the Agency to the repayment of all funds expended, or expenses incurred, under this Agreement.

SECTION 5: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee. The Agency agrees that it will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Tennessee in actions that may arise under this Agreement. The Agency acknowledges and agrees that any rights or claims

against the State of Tennessee or its employees hereunder, and any remedies arising therefrom, shall be subject to and limited to those rights and remedies, if any, available under Tennessee Code Annotated, Sections 9-8-101 through 9-8-407.

<u>SECTION 6</u>: Nothing in this Agreement, whether express or implied, is intended to confer upon any person or entity not a party to this Agreement, any rights or remedies by reason of this Agreement.

SECTION 7: The Agency shall comply with all the requirements imposed by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42-U.S.C. §2000d), 49 C.F.R., Part 21, and related statutes and regulations.

SECTION 8: The Agency hereby agrees, warrants, and assures that no person shall be excluded from participation in be denied benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Agreement or in the employment practices of the Agency on the grounds of handicap or disability age, race color, religion, sex, national origin, or any other classification protected by federal and Tennessee constitutional or statutory law. The Agency shall, upon request, show proof of such nondiscrimination and shall post in conspicuous places available to all employees and applicants, notices of nondiscrimination.

SECTION 9: The Department may terminate this Agreement without cause for any reason. Said termination shall not be deemed a breach of contract by the Department. The Department shall give the Agency at least thirty (30) days written notice before the effective termination date. Upon such termination, the Agency shall have no right to any actual general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount. SECTION 11. The Department shall have no liability except as specifically provided in this Agreement.

SECTION 12: The Agency warrants that no amount shall be paid directly or indirectly to an employee or official of the State of Tennessee as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as an officer, agent, employee, subcontractor, or consultant to the Agency in connection with any work contemplated or performed relative to this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Department of Transportation Multimodal Access Grant funds can be used to provide the necessary funds to local governments to support the transportation needs of transit users, pedestrians and bicyclists through infrastructure projects that address existing gaps around and along state routes;

SECTION 2, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that fees and commissions earned by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Masters, Register, and the Sheriff operating under Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.), Section 8-22-104 are reported to the County monthly. All operating expenses including salaries are appropriated for them and their deputies. Personnel

amounts are to be set in accordance with governing statutes. The shift rotation differential rate for the various departments under the Sheriff shall be continued at the rate of twenty-five (25) cents for the second shift and thirty-five (35) cents for the third shift for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2026. The employee benefits are established by this governing body therefore the amounts are calculated and spread to the various departments by the Office of Finance Director for the original budget each fiscal year and updated annually each fiscal year. Any amendments to the benefits accounts except to cover additional positions created during the fiscal year will originate from the Office of Finance Director.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that travel claim amounts for the officials set out in Section 2 and other county personnel shall be limited to the policy as prescribed by the State of Tennessee unless otherwise described under county travel policy. All requests for travel reimbursements shall be filed in compliance with the County Travel Policy.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved by pursuant to Chapter 46 Private Acts of 2020. A copy of all budget amendments to be presented to the Budget Committee shall be filed with the Office of Finance Director for review before close for business on the day before the scheduled meeting. Requisitions for capital expenses presented to the Purchasing Department shall be forwarded to the Office of Finance Director to review impact on cash flow before processing is completed by the Purchasing Department. Any requisition not approved for processing due to impact on cash flow and returned to the Purchasing Department may be presented to the Budget Committee for consideration by the Finance Director or upon request by the requisitioning department. The Finance Director's approval required by this section is not applicable to the items with cost of \$15,000 or less or funded through state and federal grants, which have been submitted for review and approved separate from other budgets.

SECTION 5, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute, is made in lieu of, but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution division or department for the year ending June

30, 2026. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item. Insurance losses shall be recovered against the respective departments (General, Highways or Schools).

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all grant appropriations reflected in this document are approved and shall continue for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026; however, if funding should be discontinued by the respective government agency, the appropriations and the participation in the grant program are discontinued.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by T.C.A., Section 9-21-403.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all contributions to nonprofit organizations shall be appropriated in compliance with T.C.A., Section 5-9-109. The Budget Committee shall instruct the Director of Finance Director to make appropriate disbursements to each organization at the appropriate time based upon need and economic conditions. Volunteer fire departments shall not be considered for contributions until confirmation of compliance with T.C.A., Section 68-102-3 relative to financial accountability of volunteer fire departments.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that donation/contribution accounts previously paid shall be authorized to expend to the level of any beginning balance and current year's revenues generated for those purposes. Any unexpended amounts on June 30th of each year may be added to the respective program's appropriations for the subsequent year. These accounts include EMS Education Funds / Donations, L.E.P.C., Archive Fees and Donations, Library Contributions, and Park Donations. Beginning July 1, 2025 the Data Processing Fees for the Circuit Court Clerk, Chancery Court, Courtroom Security, Victim's Assessment Fee, Title Registration & Print Fees shall be combined with the operating budget for the respective department. Any amount of revenues exceeding the initial appropriation may be amended into the needed appropriation accounts in the same method as prescribed in this document. If funds generated for the respective year do not equal or exceed the estimated actual expended amounts, then this overage will be reduced from the revenues generated in the subsequent fiscal year. Any of the

available funding exceeding the current year expenditures shall be reserved to cover future expenditures as with other restricted funds.

SECTION 10. Sullivan County hereby establishes and will maintain a spending prioritization policy as defined herein in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 54 Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions. This Policy shall apply to all of Sullivan County's governmental funds. Sullivan County will reduce fund balance restricted amounts first when expenditures are incurred for purposes for which both restricted and unrestricted (committed, assigned, or unassigned) amounts are available. All future restricted amounts shall be based upon action by this body taken after July 1, 2013. The County reduces any future committed amounts first, followed by assigned amounts and then unassigned amounts when expenditures are incurred for purposes for which amounts in any of those unrestricted fund balance classifications could be used.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on tax revenue anticipation notes (TRAN), provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2025 - 2026 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable section of T.C.A., Section 9-21. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2026.

SECTION 12. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the delinquent County property taxes for the year 2024 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2026, shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2024. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 13. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2026 unless specifically directed by this body otherwise. These designations shall be calculated by the Office of Finance Director as June 30th of each year dependent upon available funding or redirection by this body.

SECTION 14. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict and provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.
